A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Code Section 15-11-94 and Title 19 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to grounds for termination of parental rights and domestic relations, respectively, so as to provide for additional grounds for terminating parental rights; to provide for circumstances when visitation rights shall be denied; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.** 8 Code Section 15-11-94 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to grounds for 9 termination of parental rights, is amended by revising paragraph (5) of subsection (b) as 10 follows: 11 "(5) The parent has been convicted of the murder of the child's other parent or the parent 12 caused the child to be conceived as a result of rape in violation of Code Section 16-6-1, statutory rape in violation of Code Section 16-6-3, child molestation in violation of Code 13 14 Section 16-6-4, sexual assault in violation of Code Section 16-6-5.1, or incest in violation of Code Section 16-6-22." 15 16 **SECTION 2.** Title 19 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to domestic relations, is 17 amended by revising subsection (b) of Code Section 19-7-1, relating to in whom parental 18 19 power lies, as follows: 20 "(b) Parental power shall be lost by: (1) Voluntary contract releasing the right to a third person; 21 22 (2) Consent to the adoption of the child by a third person; 23 (3) Failure to provide necessaries for the child or abandonment of the child; (4) Consent to the child's receiving the proceeds of his or her own labor, which consent 24 25 shall be revocable at any time;

38	inability, as set out in paragraph (2), (3), or (4), or (5) of subsection (b) of Code Section

40	SECTION 4.
41	Said title is further amended by revising subparagraph (a)(3)(D) of Code Section 19-8-11,
42	relating to petitioning superior court to terminate parental rights, as follows:
43	"(D) Parent has failed to exercise proper parental care or control due to misconduct or
44	inability, as set out in paragraph (2), (3), σ (4), σ (5) of subsection (b) of Code Section
45	15-11-94,"
46	SECTION 5.
47	Said title is further amended by adding a new subsection to Code Section 19-9-3, relating to
48	the discretion of the judge in custody disputes and review of visitation rights, to read as
49	follows:
50	"(a.1)(1) In any proceeding in which visitation of a child is being sought by a parent, if
51	such child was conceived as a result of rape in violation of Code Section 16-6-1, statutory
52	rape in violation of Code Section 16-6-3, child molestation in violation of Code Section
53	16-6-4, sexual assault in violation of Code Section 16-6-5.1, or incest in violation of
54	Code Section 16-6-22, the parent who committed such act shall be denied visitation rights
55	with such child.
56	(2) In any proceeding in which visitation of a child is being sought by any person who
57	the court determines by a preponderance of the evidence intentionally caused the death
58	of such child's parent, such person shall be denied visitation rights with such child."
