A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 elementary and secondary education, so as to provide for mandatory kindergarten for all
- 3 children prior to entering into first grade; to lower the age of compulsory school attendance
- 4 from six years old to five years old; to provide for related matters; to provide for contingent
- 5 effectiveness; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to elementary and
- 9 secondary education, is amended in Code Section 20-2-150, relating to eligibility for
- 10 enrollment for educational programs, by revising subsection (c) as follows:
- 11 "(c) All children enrolled for 20 school days or more in the public schools of this state
- prior to their seventh fifth birthday shall become subject to all of the provisions of this
- article, the provisions of Code Sections 20-2-690 through 20-2-701, and the rules and
- regulations of the State Board of Education relating to compulsory school attendance even
- though they have not attained seven five years of age."

SECTION 2.

- 17 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 20-2-151, relating to general and career
- 18 education programs, by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (b) as follows:
- 19 "(1)(A) All local school systems may shall offer a full-day kindergarten program. For
- purposes of this subsection, the term 'full-day kindergarten program' means a student
- 21 is provided classroom instruction for a minimum of four and one-half hours daily for
- a 180 day school year, or the equivalent thereof as determined in accordance with State
- 23 Board of Education guidelines.
- 24 (B) It is the policy of this state that <u>all children shall attend kindergarten for one school</u>
- 25 <u>year prior to enrolling in first grade and that</u> the purposes of the kindergarten program

shall be to provide all children with an equal opportunity to become prepared for a successful first grade experience and to acquire the foundation for academic progress throughout the students' educational careers. To be eligible for enrollment in a state supported kindergarten program, a child must attain the age of five by September 1, except as otherwise provided by subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-150;"

31 SECTION 3.

- 32 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 20-2-690.1, relating to mandatory education
- 33 for children between the ages of six and 16, by revising subsection (a) as follows:
- 34 "(a) Mandatory attendance in a public school, private school, or home school program shall
- 35 be required for children between their sixth fifth and sixteenth birthdays. Such mandatory
- 36 attendance shall not be required where the child has successfully completed all
- 37 requirements for a high school diploma."

38 SECTION 4.

- 39 This Act shall become effective only upon the effective date of a specific appropriation of
- 40 funds for purposes of this Act, as expressed in a line item making specific reference to such
- 41 Act in a General Appropriations Act enacted by the General Assembly.

42 SECTION 5.

43 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
