A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 3 of Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the practice of pharmacy, so as to authorize qualified pharmacy technicians to
- 3 administer certain vaccines; to provide for a definition; to provide for conditions; to provide
- 4 for requirements for qualification; to provide requirements for the supervising pharmacist;
- 5 to provide for rules and regulations; to provide for statutory construction; to amend Code
- 6 Section 43-34-26.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to vaccine protocol
- 7 agreements, so as to revise a provision regarding delegation of authority by a pharmacist; to
- 8 provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and
- 9 for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- SECTION 1.
- 12 Article 3 of Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- practice of pharmacy, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 14 "26-4-52.

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- 15 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'vaccine' means any COVID-19 vaccine and any
- vaccine that is included on the adult immunization schedule recommended by the Advisory

17 Committee on Immunization Practices of the federal Centers for Disease Control and

- 18 Prevention.
- 19 (b) At the discretion of a supervising pharmacist, a qualified pharmacy technician may be
- 20 <u>authorized to administer vaccines pursuant to this Code section under the following</u>
- 21 <u>conditions:</u>
- 22 (1) The vaccine administration has been delegated by the supervising pharmacist to the
- 23 qualified pharmacy technician;
- 24 (2) The supervising pharmacist shall be readily and immediately available to the
- 25 qualified pharmacy technician administering the vaccine;
- 26 (3) The vaccine shall be administered only to individuals 18 years of age or older;
- 27 (4) The vaccine being administered shall be authorized or licensed for use by the federal
- Food and Drug Administration; and
- 29 (5) In the case of a COVID-19 vaccine, the vaccine shall be dispensed and administered
- 30 <u>according to the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices of the federal Centers</u>
- for Disease Control and Prevention COVID-19 vaccine recommendations.
- 32 (c) In order to become a qualified pharmacy technician and be authorized to administer
- 33 <u>vaccines pursuant to this Code section, a pharmacy technician shall:</u>
- 34 (1) Have completed a course of training accredited by the Accreditation Council for
- 35 Pharmacy Education or similar health authority or professional body approved by the
- 36 <u>board that includes hands-on injection techniques and the recognition and treatment of</u>
- 37 <u>emergency reactions to vaccines;</u>
- 38 (2) Hold current certification in Basic Cardiac Life Support; and
- 39 (3) Have completed a minimum of two hours of training of immunization related
- 40 <u>continuing pharmacy education approved by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy</u>
- Education or similar health authority or professional body approved by the board during
- 42 <u>each biennium preceding application for renewal of his or her certificate of registration.</u>
- 43 (d) The supervising pharmacist shall:

44 (1) Comply with record-keeping and reporting requirements established by the board; 45 (2) Make documented reasonable efforts to obtain the name of the patient's primary care 46 provider and to notify such primary care provider of the vaccine administered by the 47 qualified pharmacy technician within 72 hours of administration; (3) Be responsible for complying with requirements related to reporting adverse events: 48 (4) Check the Georgia Registry of Immunization Transactions and Services established 49 pursuant to Code Section 31-12-3.1 prior to dispensing the vaccine to be administered by 50 51 the qualified pharmacy technician and enter the patient's vaccine information in such 52 registry in accordance with the registry's designated time frame and other requirements; 53 and 54 (5) Comply with any applicable requirements or conditions of use set forth in the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention COVID-19 vaccine provider agreement and 55 56 any other federal requirements that apply to the administration of COVID-19 vaccines. (e) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to implement the 57 58 provisions of this Code section. (f) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to require any pharmacist to authorize 59 60 a pharmacy technician to administer vaccines pursuant to this Code section or to require 61 any pharmacy technician to administer vaccines pursuant to this Code section. (g) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to authorize a qualified pharmacy 62 technician to order vaccines." 63

64 SECTION 2.

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Code Section 43-34-26.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to vaccine protocol agreements, is amended by revising subsection (e) as follows:

"(e)(1) A pharmacist who is a party to a vaccine protocol agreement pursuant to this Code section shall not delegate the administration of a vaccine to any individual other than:

- 70 (A) A a pharmacy intern; or 71 (B) A qualified pharmacy technician in accordance with paragraph (2) of this 72 subsection, 73 under the direct supervision of the pharmacist whether or not any such other individual is under the supervision, direct or otherwise, of the pharmacist. 74 (2) A pharmacist who is a party to a vaccine protocol agreement pursuant to this Code 75 76 section may authorize one or more qualified pharmacy technicians to administer vaccines 77 pursuant to Code Section 26-4-52 so long as: 78 (A) The physician with whom the vaccine protocol agreement is entered into has 79 approved such authorization; and 80 (B) Such authorization is included in the vaccine protocol agreement between the 81 physician and pharmacist." 82 **SECTION 3.** 83 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law 84 without such approval.
- 85 SECTION 4.
- 86 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
