The Senate Committee on Regulated Industries and Utilities offered the following substitute to HB 434:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 physicians, assistants, and others, so as to provide for the licensing of radiologist assistants; 3 to provide for continuing education requirements; to repeal a provision relating to radiologist assistant defined; to provide a short title; to provide for definitions; to provide for licensure 5 requirements; to provide for renewal requirements; to prohibit holding oneself out as a 6 radiologist assistant without licensure; to provide for licensure for currently employed 7 radiologist assistants; to provide for the duties and powers of the Georgia Composite Medical 8 Board with respect to radiologist assistants; to provide that radiologists may use the services 9 of licensed radiologist assistants; to prohibit certain practices by radiologist assistants; to 10 provide for an advisory committee; to provide for statutory construction; to provide for 11 related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 12 purposes.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

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Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to physicians, assistants, and others, is amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 43-34-11, relating to continuing education requirement and required training for physicians, as follows: "(a)(1) The board shall be authorized to require persons seeking renewal of a license, certificate, or permit under this chapter to complete board approved continuing education of not less than 40 hours biennially. The board shall be authorized to approve courses offered by institutions of higher learning, specialty societies, or professional organizations, including, but not limited to, the American Medical Association, the National Medical Association, and the American Osteopathic Association, the number of hours required, and the category in which these hours should be earned. This paragraph shall not apply to respiratory care professionals, persons seeking renewal of certification as respiratory care professionals, clinical perfusionists, persons seeking renewal of licensure as a clinical perfusionist, licensed orthotists or prosthetists, persons seeking renewal of licensure as an orthotist or prosthetist, genetic counselors, or persons seeking renewal of licensure as a genetic counselor, radiologist assistants, or persons seeking renewal of licensure as a radiologist assistant. (2) The board shall be authorized to require persons seeking renewal of certification as respiratory care professionals under Article 6 of this chapter to complete board approved continuing education. The board shall be authorized to establish the number of hours of continuing education required biennially for renewal of certification as a respiratory care professional and the categories in which these hours should be earned. The board shall be authorized to approve courses offered by institutions of higher learning, specialty societies, or professional organizations. Any action taken by the board pursuant to this paragraph shall be taken in conformity with the provisions of Code Section 43-34-143. (3) The board shall be authorized to require persons seeking renewal of licensure as

clinical perfusionists under Article 7 of this chapter to complete board approved

continuing education. The board shall be authorized to establish the number of hours of continuing education required biennially for renewal of licensure as a clinical perfusionist and the categories in which these hours should be earned. The board shall be authorized to approve courses offered by institutions of higher learning, specialty societies, or professional organizations. Any action taken by the board pursuant to this paragraph shall be taken in conformity with the provisions of Code Section 43-34-172.

- (4) The board shall be authorized to require persons seeking renewal of licensure to practice orthotics or prosthetics under Article 8 of this chapter to complete board approved continuing education. The board shall be authorized to establish the number of hours of continuing education required biennially for renewal of licensure to practice orthotics or prosthetics and the categories in which these hours should be earned, provided that the maximum number of hours of continuing education required for renewal of licensure shall not exceed 40 hours. The board shall be authorized to approve courses offered by institutions of higher learning, specialty societies, or professional organizations. Any action taken by the board pursuant to this paragraph shall be taken in conformity with the provisions of subsection (a) of Code Section 43-34-200.
- (5) The board shall be authorized to require persons seeking renewal of licensure to practice genetic counseling under Article 12 of this chapter to complete board approved continuing education. The board shall be authorized to establish the number of hours of continuing education required biennially for renewal of licensure to practice genetic counseling and the categories in which these hours should be earned, provided that the number of hours of continuing education required for renewal of licensure shall not be less than 30 hours biennially. The board shall be authorized to approve courses offered by institutions of higher learning, specialty societies, or professional organizations. Any action taken by the board pursuant to this paragraph shall be taken in conformity with the provisions of subsection (b) of Code Section 43-34-313.

67 (6) The board shall be authorized to require persons seeking renewal of licensure to practice as a radiologist assistant under Article 13 of this chapter to complete board 68 approved continuing education. The board shall be authorized to establish the number 69 70 of hours of continuing education required biennially for renewal of licensure to practice 71 as a radiologist assistant and the categories in which these hours should be earned. The 72 board shall be authorized to approve courses offered by institutions of higher learning, 73 specialty societies, or professional organizations. Any action taken by the board pursuant 74 to this paragraph shall be taken in conformity with the provisions of subsection (b) of 75 Code Section 43-34-334. 76 (6)(7) On and after January 1, 2022, all physicians shall be required to receive one-time 77 education and training, for a minimum of two hours, regarding professional boundaries 78 and physician sexual misconduct. Such education and training shall include subject 79 matter relating to how to proceed with basic as well as sensitive or intimate examinations 80 and the communication with patients that is required as a component of such 81 examinations. Such education and training shall be established by the board and shall be 82 informed by members of the public, as best possible."

84 Said chapter is further amended by repealing Code Section 43-34-12, relating to radiologist assistant defined.

86 SECTION 3.

87 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new article to read as follows:

- 205 <u>article</u>. Subsequent advisory committee members must be licensed pursuant to this article.

- Nothing in this article shall be construed to prohibit:

208 (1) The performance of any tasks or responsibilities by any student engaged in clinical 209 training in a general hospital, provided such practice is limited to clinical training that 210 shall be carried out under the direct supervision of a radiologist; (2) The performance of any tasks or responsibilities by any person licensed under this 211 212 title, provided such tasks or responsibilities are permitted by the article governing the profession pursuant to which such person is licensed; or 213 (3) The performance of any tasks or responsibilities by any legally qualified radiologist 214 assistants of any other state or territory who is serving in the armed forces or the Public 215 Health Service of the United States or who is employed by the United States Department 216 217 of Veterans Affairs, while engaged in the performance of his or her duties."

218 SECTION 4.

This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

SECTION 5.

222 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
