A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 5 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to general provisions for ad valorem taxation of property, so as to repeal an
- 3 exception to the breach of a covenant for bona fide conservation use related to the solar
- 4 generation of energy; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 1 of Chapter 5 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 general provisions for ad valorem taxation of property, is amended by revising paragraph
- 10 (11) of subsection (p) of Code Section 48-5-7.4, relating to bona fide conservation use
- property, residential transitional property, application procedures, penalties for breach of
- 12 covenant, classification on tax digest, and annual report, as follows:
- 13 "(11)(A) Allowing part of the property subject to the covenant to be used for solar
- 14 generation of energy and conversion of such energy into heat or electricity, and the sale of
- 15 the same in accordance with applicable law.

(B) The provisions of subparagraph (A) of this paragraph shall not allow the portion of the property on which such solar energy generating equipment is located, as depicted by a boundary survey prepared by a licensed surveyor, and which is subject to an existing covenant to remain in the covenant. Such property shall be removed from the existing covenant at the time of the installation of the solar energy generating equipment and shall be subject to the penalty for breach of the covenant contained in subsection (q) of this Code section and shall be subject to ad valorem taxation at fair market value Reserved; or"
