## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 26-4-80 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 dispensing prescription drugs, so as to authorize certain refills of topical ophthalmic products
- 3 under certain conditions; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 4 other purposes.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6	SECTION 1.

- 7 Code Section 26-4-80 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to dispensing
- 8 prescription drugs, is amended by revising subsection (f) as follows:
- 9 ''(f)(1) When filling a prescription or refilling a prescription which may be refilled, the
- pharmacist shall exercise professional judgment in the matter. No prescription shall be
- filled or refilled with greater frequency than the approximate interval of time that the
- dosage regimen ordered by the <u>prescriber practitioner</u> would indicate, unless extenuating
- circumstances are documented which would justify a shorter interval of time before the
- filling or refilling of the prescription.
- 15 (2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, in order to prevent unintended
- interruptions in drug therapy for topical ophthalmic products:
- 17 (A) A pharmacist shall be authorized, without obtaining subsequent authorization from
- the practitioner or obtaining a new prescription from the practitioner, to permit refills
- 19 <u>at 70 percent of the predicted days of use; and</u>
- 20 (B) A practitioner shall be permitted to authorize refills earlier than 70 percent of the
- 21 <u>predicted days of use.</u>
- 22 This paragraph shall apply to refills purchased through retail pharmacies and mail order
- 23 <u>sources."</u>

## SECTION 2.

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
