- 11 (a) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter to the contrary, the General
- 12 Assembly may provide by local Act for the election in nonpartisan elections of candidates
- to fill the office of district attorney for a judicial circuit or solicitors-general of state courts.
- 14 (b) The names of all candidates who have qualified with the election superintendent for
- such office of district attorney for a judicial circuit or solicitors-general of state courts shall
- be placed on the ballot in a nonpartisan general election to be held and conducted jointly

17 with the general primary in each even-numbered year. No candidate for any such office shall be nominated by a political party or by a petition as a candidate of a political body or 18 19 as an independent candidate. Candidates for any such office shall have their names placed 20 on the nonpartisan portion of each ballot only after meeting those requirements prescribed 21 in Code Section 21-2-132 specifically related to such nonpartisan candidates and by paying 22 the requisite qualifying fees as prescribed in Code Section 21-2-131. Candidates shall be 23 listed on the official ballot in a nonpartisan general election as provided in Code Sections 24 21-2-284.1 and 21-2-285.1, respectively. Except as otherwise specified in this chapter, the procedures to be employed in conducting the nonpartisan general election of any such 25 26 district attorney or solicitor-general shall conform as nearly as practicable to the procedures 27 governing general elections; and such general election procedures as are necessary to complete this nonpartisan general election process shall be adopted in a manner consistent 28 29 with such nonpartisan elections."

30 SECTION 2.

31 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
