A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 3 of Chapter 7 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to arson and explosives, so as to provide for the offense of arson of a law
- 3 enforcement vehicle; to provide for a penalty; to amend Code Section 17-6-1 of the Official
- 4 Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to when offenses bailable, procedure, schedule of bails,
- 5 and appeal bonds, so as to include the offense of arson of a law enforcement vehicle; to
- 6 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Article 3 of Chapter 7 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to arson
- 10 and explosives is amended by adding a new Code section, to read as follows:
- 11 "16-7-60.1.
- 12 (a) A person commits the offense of arson of a law enforcement vehicle when, by means
- of fire or explosive, he or she knowingly damages or knowingly causes, aids, abets,
- 14 <u>advises, encourages, hires, counsels, or procures another to damage a law enforcement</u>
- 15 <u>vehicle.</u>

(b) A person convicted of the offense of arson of a law enforcement vehicle shall be
 punished by a fine of not more than \$100,000.00 or by imprisonment for not less than five
 years nor more than 20 years, or both."

19 SECTION 2.

- 20 Code Section 17-6-1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to when offenses
- 21 bailable, procedure, schedule of bails, and appeal bonds, is amended by adding a new
- 22 paragraph to subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 23 "11.1 Arson of a law enforcement vehicle under Code Section 16-7-60.1."
- 24 SECTION 3.
- 25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
