## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
elections and primaries generally, so as to revise the times for advance voting; to provide for
related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

5 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to elections and 6 7 primaries generally, is amended by revising subsection (d) of Code Section 21-2-385, 8 relating to procedure for voting by absentee ballot and advance voting, as follows: 9 ''(d)(1) There shall be a period of advance voting that shall commence: 10 (A) On the fourth third Monday immediately prior to each primary or election; 11 (B) On the fourth third Monday immediately prior to a runoff from a general primary; 12 (C) On the fourth third Monday immediately prior to a runoff from a general election 13 in which there are candidates for a federal office on the ballot in the runoff; and 14 (D) As soon as possible prior to a runoff from any other general election in which there 15 are only state or county candidates on the ballot in the runoff but no later than the second Monday immediately prior to such runoff 16

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17 and shall end on the Friday immediately prior to each primary, election, or runoff. 18 Voting shall be conducted during normal business hours beginning at 7:00 A.M. and 19 ending at 7:00 P.M. on weekdays during such period and shall be conducted on the 20 second Saturday and Sunday prior to a primary or election during the hours of 9:00 A.M. 21 through 4:00 P.M. beginning at 9:00 A.M. and ending at 5:00 P.M. on Saturday and 22 beginning at 1:00 P.M. and ending at 5:00 P.M. on Sunday; provided, however, that, in 23 primaries and elections in which there are no federal or state candidates on the ballot, no 24 Saturday voting hours shall be required if Thanksgiving Day falls in the advance voting 25 period, no advance voting shall be held on such day; and provided, further, that, if such 26 second Saturday or Sunday is a public and legal holiday pursuant to Code Section 1-4-1, 27 if such second Saturday or Sunday follows a public and legal holiday occurring on the 28 Thursday or Friday immediately preceding such second Saturday or Sunday, or if such 29 second Saturday or Sunday immediately precedes a public and legal holiday occurring 30 on the following Sunday or Monday, such advance voting shall not be held on such 31 second Saturday and Sunday but shall be held on the third Saturday and Sunday prior to 32 such primary or election. Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, counties and 33 municipalities may extend the hours for voting beyond regular business hours and may 34 provide for additional voting locations pursuant to Code Section 21-2-382 to suit the 35 needs of the electors of the jurisdiction at their option; provided, however, that voting 36 shall occur only on the days specified in this paragraph, and counties and municipalities 37 shall not be authorized to conduct advance voting on any other days or at any other hours. 38 (2) The registrars or absentee ballot clerk, as appropriate, shall provide reasonable notice 39 to the electors of their jurisdiction of the availability of advance voting as well as the 40 times, dates, and locations at which advance voting will be conducted. In addition, the 41 registrars or absentee ballot clerk shall notify the Secretary of State in the manner prescribed by the Secretary of State of the times, dates, and locations at which advance 42 43 voting will be conducted.

- 46 Each such advance voting location shall be equipped with a minimum of six ballot
- 47 <u>marking devices and three poll pads.</u>"

- 49 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
