A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 primaries and elections generally, so as to provide for the means and manner of establishing
- 3 identity and eligibility to vote for voter registration purposes; to provide for acceptable forms
- 4 of identification; to provide that the failure to match information on a government data base
- 5 shall not be grounds to not register a person to vote; to provide for related matters; to provide
- 6 an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to primaries and
- 10 elections generally, is amended by revising Code Section 21-2-220.1, relating to required
- 11 documentation for voter registration, as follows:
- 12 "21-2-220.1.

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- 13 (a) Any person applying to register to vote shall provide his or her Georgia driver's license
- number or identification card number for an identification card issued pursuant to Article 5
- of Chapter 5 of Title 40 on the voter registration application. If a person does not have a
- 16 Georgia driver's license or identification card issued pursuant to Article 5 of Chapter 5 of
- 17 Title 40, such person shall provide the last four digits of his or her social security number
- on the voter registration application. If a person does not have a Georgia driver's license,
- a Georgia identification card issued pursuant to Article 5 of Chapter 5 of Title 40, or a
- social security number, the person shall affirm this fact in the manner prescribed in the
- voter registration application upon penalty of law and such application shall be processed
- 22 without regard to the procedures outlined in subsections (b), (c), and (d) of this Code
- 23 section.
- 24 (b) For those voter registration applicants who have a Georgia driver's license number or
- 25 identification card number for an identification card issued pursuant to Article 5 of
- 26 Chapter 5 of Title 40, or the last four digits of a social security number, a voter registration

27 application may be accepted as valid only after the board of registrars has verified the 28 authenticity of the Georgia driver's license number, the identification card number of an 29 identification card issued pursuant to Article 5 of Chapter 5 of Title 40, or the last four 30 digits of the social security number provided by the applicant In the event that the 31 information provided by the person registering to vote on the voter registration form does 32 not match information about the applicant on the Department of Driver Services data base, 33 the HAVV data base of the federal Social Security Administration, or other government data bases, the applicant shall nevertheless be registered to vote but shall be required to 34 produce proof of the applicant's identity and eligibility to vote to a county registrar, a 35 36 deputy county registrar, a poll manager, or a poll worker at or before the time that such applicant requests a ballot for the first time in any federal, state, or local election. 37

- (c) The authenticity of an applicant's Georgia driver's license number, identification card
 number of an identification card issued pursuant to Article 5 of Chapter 5 of Title 40, or
 the last four digits of the social security number may be verified by:
- (1) The board of registrars matching the Georgia driver's license number, identification card number of an identification card issued pursuant to Article 5 of Chapter 5 of Title 40, or the last four digits of the social security number provided by the applicant with the applicant's record on file with the Department of Driver Services or the federal
- 45 Social Security Administration; or
- 46 (2) The applicant providing sufficient evidence to the board of registrars to verify the
 47 applicant's identity, which sufficient evidence includes, but is not limited to, providing
 48 one of the forms of identification listed in subsection (a) of Code Section 21-2-417 Proof
 49 of the applicant's identity and eligibility to vote as set forth in subsection (b) of this Code
- section includes, but is not limited to:
- 51 (1) A current or expired Georgia driver's license;
- 52 (2) A current or expired Georgia identification card issued pursuant to Article 5 of
- 53 <u>Chapter 5 of Title 40;</u>
- 54 (3) A student identification card issued by a Georgia high school, community college,
- 55 <u>technical college, university, public or private college, trade school, or other secondary</u>
- or postsecondary educational organization;
- 57 (4) A Georgia hunting or fishing license;
- 58 (5) A valid driver's license or identification card issued by another state;
- 59 (6) A military or other federal, state, or local identification card;
- 60 (7) A federal, state, or local or private company employee identification card;
- 61 (8) A social security card;

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(9) An affirmation of the applicant's identity and eligibility to vote by a family member,

neighbor, friend, coworker, poll worker, poll manager, election official, or other 63 64 individual with knowledge of the applicant's identity or eligibility to vote; and (10) Other documentation confirming the identity of the applicant and his or her 65 eligibility to vote in this state. 66 67 (d)(1) If a completed voter registration application has been received by the registration deadline set by Code Section 21-2-224 but the Georgia driver's license number, the 68 69 identification card number of an identification card issued pursuant to Article 5 of Chapter 70 5 of Title 40, or the last four digits of the social security number provided by the applicant cannot be verified, the applicant shall be notified that the number cannot be verified and 71 72 that the applicant must provide sufficient evidence to the board of registrars to verify the applicant's identity in order to have his or her application processed by the board of 73 74 registrars. 75 (2) If the applicant provides such sufficient evidence on or before the date of a primary or election, and if the applicant is found eligible to vote, the applicant shall be added to 76 77 the list of electors and shall be permitted to vote in the primary or election and any runoff 78 resulting therefrom and subsequent primaries and elections. 79 (3) If the applicant has not provided such sufficient evidence or such number has not 80 otherwise been verified on or before the date of a primary or election, the applicant 81 presenting himself or herself to vote shall be provided a provisional ballot. The 82 provisional ballot shall be counted only if such number is verified by the end of the time 83 period set forth in subsection (c) of Code Section 21-2-419 or if the applicant presents 84 sufficient evidence to the board of registrars to verify the applicant's identity, by the end of the time period set forth in subsection (c) of Code Section 21-2-419. 85 86 (4) The voter application shall be rejected if the Georgia driver's license number, 87 identification card number of an identification card issued pursuant to Article 5 of Chapter 5 of Title 40, or last four digits of the social security number provided by the 88 applicant is not verified and the applicant fails to present sufficient evidence to the board 89 90 of registrars to verify the applicant's identity within 26 months following the date of the 91 application. 92 (5) This subsection shall not apply to an electronic voter registration application submitted pursuant to Code Section 21-2-221.2 No voter registration application which 93 is complete on its face shall be cancelled, rejected, or put into pending status solely on 94 the grounds that the information on the registration form failed to match information 95 about the applicant on the Department of Driver Services, federal Social Security 96 97 Administration, or other government data bases."

98 SECTION 2.

This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming lawwithout such approval.

101 SECTION 3.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
