A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 1 of Title 51 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 general provisions pertaining to torts, so as to establish immunity from liability for injury or
- 3 death related to skydiving; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

5	SECTION 1.
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- 6 Chapter 1 of Title 51 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- 7 provisions pertaining to torts, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 8 "<u>51-1-52.</u>
- 9 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- (1) 'Aircraft' means an airplane, helicopter, or any other vehicle used for flight for the
- 11 purpose of engaging in a skydiving activity.
- 12 (2) 'Engages in a skydiving activity' means:
- (A) Any person, whether amateur or professional, who trains, assists, equips, guides,
- and instructs anyone with the intent to skydive;
- 15 (B) Any pilot, flight crew member, or ground crew member of an aircraft or any
- passenger aboard an aircraft engaged in a skydiving activity;
- 17 (C) Any person visiting, touring, or utilizing a skydiving facility as part of an event or
- 18 <u>skydiving activity; or</u>
- (D) Any person who assists a participant or skydiving activity sponsor in a skydiving
- 20 <u>activity.</u>
- The term 'engages in a skydiving activity' shall not include being a spectator at a
- 22 <u>skydiving activity.</u>
- 23 (3) 'Inherent risks of skydiving activities' means those dangers or conditions which are
- 24 <u>an integral part of skydiving activities, including, but not limited to:</u>
- 25 (A) Failure of a device to properly slow descent while descending through the air;
- 26 (B) Certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions;

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- 27 (C) Collisions with other persons or natural or manmade obstacles; and
- 28 (D) The potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to
- 29 <u>injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the parachute,</u>
- 30 <u>not acting within the participant's ability, and the contingent and unpredictable nature</u>
- of near ground weather conditions.
- 32 (4) 'Parachute' means a nonmotorized device used, or intended to be used, for descent to
- 33 <u>the ground from an aircraft in flight.</u>
- 34 (5) 'Participant' means any person, whether amateur or professional, who engages in a
- 35 <u>skydiving activity, whether or not a fee is paid to participate in such activity.</u>
- 36 (6) 'Skydiving activity' means:
- 37 (A) The descent of one or more persons to the ground from an aircraft in flight when
- a parachute is intended to be used during all or part of that descent;
- 39 (B) Skydiving training or teaching activities; and
- 40 (C) Packing, closing, rigging, and inspecting or evaluating parachute equipment
- belonging to another whether or not the owner has received some monetary
- 42 <u>consideration or other thing of value for the use of such equipment or is permitting a</u>
- prospective purchaser of the equipment to use, inspect, or evaluate the equipment.
- 44 (3) 'Skydiving activity sponsor' means any person or his or her agent who for profit or
- 45 <u>not for profit sponsors, organizes, or provides the facilities, aircraft, or equipment for a</u>
- 46 <u>skydiving activity or who otherwise engages in a skydiving activity, including but not</u>
- 47 <u>limited to clubs, skydiving schools, school and college sponsored classes and programs,</u>
- 48 <u>and operators, instructors, and promoters of skydiving facilities, including but not limited</u>
- 49 <u>to locations, fields, airports, and airfields at which the skydiving activity is held.</u>
- 50 (4) 'Skydiving professional' means a person engaged for compensation in:
- 51 (A) Instructing or accompanying a participant in a skydiving activity; or
- 52 (B) Renting or providing equipment to a participant.
- 53 (b) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this Code section, a skydiving activity sponsor,
- 54 <u>a skydiving professional, or any other person, including a corporation or partnership, shall</u>
- 55 not be liable for an injury to or the death of a participant resulting from the inherent risks
- of skydiving activities and, except as provided in subsection (d) of this Code section, no
- 57 participant or participant's representative shall make any claim against, maintain an action
- 58 <u>against, or recover from a skydiving activity sponsor, a skydiving professional, or any other</u>
- 59 person for injury, loss, damage, or death of the participant resulting from any of the
- 60 <u>inherent risks of skydiving activities.</u>
- 61 (c) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this Code section, no participant who has
- 62 <u>knowingly agreed to assume all inherent risks of skydiving activities may maintain an</u>

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63 <u>action against or recover from a skydiving activity sponsor or a skydiving professional for</u>

- an injury to or the death of a participant engaged in a skydiving activity.
- 65 (d) Nothing in subsection (b) or (c) of this Code section shall prevent or limit the liability
- of a skydiving activity sponsor, a skydiving professional, or any other person if the
- 67 <u>skydiving activity sponsor, skydiving professional, or person:</u>
- (1) Provided the skydiving equipment and knew or should have known that the skydiving
- 69 equipment was faulty, and such skydiving equipment was faulty to the extent that it did
- 70 <u>cause the injury;</u>
- 71 (2) Failed to make reasonable and prudent efforts to determine the ability of the
- 72 participant to engage safely in the skydiving activity;
- 73 (3) Owns, leases, rents, or otherwise is in lawful possession and control of the land,
- facilities, or aircraft upon which or in which the participant sustained injuries because of
- a dangerous latent condition which was known or should have been known to the
- 36 skydiving activity sponsor, skydiving professional, or person and for which warning signs
- had not been conspicuously posted;
- 78 (3) Commits an act or omission that constitutes willful or wanton disregard for the safety
- of the participant, and that act or omission caused the injury; or
- 80 (4) Intentionally injures the participant.
- 81 (e) Nothing in subsection (b) of this Code section shall prevent or limit the liability of a
- 82 <u>skydiving activity sponsor or skydiving professional under liability provisions as set forth</u>
- 83 <u>in the products liability laws."</u>

SECTION 2.

85 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
