## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 13 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 controlled substances, so as to provide that possession of certain quantities of marijuana 3 constitute a misdemeanor; to change provisions relating to punishment; to amend Title 15, 4 Title 16, Chapter 7 of Title 17, and Code Section 36-32-6 of the Official Code of Georgia 5 Annotated, relating to courts, crimes and offenses, pretrial proceedings, and municipal court jurisdiction in marijuana possession cases, respectively, so as to provide for conforming 6 7 cross-references; to amend Code Section 35-3-33, relating to the duties of the Georgia Crime Information Center, so as to revise provisions relating to obtaining fingerprints and other 8

10 possession; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date and applicability;

identifying data on persons arrested or taken into custody for misdemeanor marijuana

11 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

13 PART I 14 **SECTION 1-1.** 

- 15 Chapter 13 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to controlled 16 substances, is amended by revising subsection (b) of Code Section 16-13-2, relating to 17 possession of marijuana and conditional discharge for possession of controlled substances
- as first offense and certain nonviolent property crimes, as follows:
- 19 "(b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any person who is charged with possession
- of marijuana, which possession is of one ounce two ounces or less, shall be guilty of a
- 21 misdemeanor and punished by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 12 months or a fine
- not to exceed \$1,000.00, or both, or public works not to exceed 12 months \$300.00."

23	SECTION 1-2.
24	Said chapter is further amended by revising paragraph (2) of subsection (j) of Code Section
25	16-13-30, relating to purchase, possession, manufacture, distribution, or sale of controlled
26	substances or marijuana, as follows:
27	"(2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c) of Code Section 16-13-31 or in Code
28	Section 16-13-2, any person who violates this subsection shall be guilty of a felony and,
29	upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one year nor
30	more than ten five years."
31	PART II
32	SECTION 2-1.
33	Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to courts, is amended by revising
34	subsection (b) of Code Section 15-7-4, relating to state court jurisdiction, as follows:
35	"(b) Each state court shall have jurisdiction, within the territorial limits of the county or
36	counties for which it was created and concurrent with other courts having such jurisdiction,
37	over possession of one ounce two ounces or less of marijuana, in accordance with Code
38	Sections 16-13-2 and 16-13-30."
39	SECTION 2-2.
40	Said title is further amended by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of Code Section
41	15-9-30.6, relating to probate court jurisdiction over certain drug and alcohol offenses, as
42	follows:
43	"(1) Possession of one ounce two ounces or less of marijuana, in accordance with Code
44	Sections 16-13-2 and 16-13-30; and"
45	SECTION 2-3.
46	Said title is further amended by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (c) of Code Section
47	15-10-260, relating to magistrate court jurisdiction, as follows:
48	"(1) For possession of less than one ounce two ounces or less of marijuana, as provided
49	in subsection (b) of Code Section 16-13-2;"
50	SECTION 2-4.
51	Chapter 13 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to controlled
52	substances, is amended by revising paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of Code Section 16-13-5,
53	relating to immunity from arrest or prosecution for persons seeking medical assistance for
54	drug overdose, as follows:

- 55 "(2) 'Drug violation' means:
- 56 (A) A violation of subsection (a) of Code Section 16-13-30 for possession of a
- 57 controlled substance if the aggregate weight, including any mixture, is less than four
- grams of a solid substance, less than one milliliter of liquid substance, or if the
- substance is placed onto a secondary medium with a combined weight of less than four
- grams;
- 61 (B) A violation of paragraph (1) of subsection (j) of Code Section 16-13-30 for
- possession of less than one ounce two ounces or less of marijuana; or
- 63 (C) A violation of Code Section 16-13-32.2, relating to possession and use of drug
- related objects."
- 65 **SECTION 2-5.**
- 66 Chapter 7 of Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to pretrial
- 67 proceedings, is amended by revising Code Section 17-7-72, relating to jurisdiction of probate
- 68 courts to try certain drug and alcohol offenses, as follows:
- 69 "17-7-72.
- 70 In probate courts which have jurisdiction over misdemeanor possession of marijuana in
- accordance with Code Sections 16-13-2 and 16-13-30 and certain misdemeanor violations
- of Code Section 3-3-23 pursuant to Code Section 15-9-30.6, the following offenses may
- be tried upon a summons or citation without an accusation:
- 74 (1) Possession of one ounce two ounces or less of marijuana, in accordance with Code
- 75 Sections 16-13-2 and 16-13-30; and
- 76 (2) Any violation of paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of Code Section 3-3-23 which is
- punishable as a misdemeanor, but not violations punishable as high and aggravated
- 78 misdemeanors."
- 79 **SECTION 2-6.**
- 80 Code Section 36-32-6 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to municipal court
- 81 jurisdiction in marijuana possession cases, is amended by revising subsections (a) and (c) as
- 82 follows:
- 83 "(a) The municipal court of any municipality is granted jurisdiction to try and dispose of
- cases where a person is charged with the possession of one ounce two ounces or less of
- marijuana if the offense occurred within the corporate limits of such municipality. The
- 36 jurisdiction of any such court shall be concurrent with the jurisdiction of any other courts
- within the county having jurisdiction to try and dispose of such cases."
- 88 "(c) Any defendant charged with possession of an ounce two ounces or less of marijuana
- in a municipal court shall be entitled on request to have the case against him or her

transferred to the court having general misdemeanor jurisdiction in the county wherein the alleged offense occurred."

93 **SECTION 3-1.** 

- Code Section 35-3-33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the duty of the Georgia Crime Information Center to obtain fingerprints and other identifying data on
- 96 persons, is amended by revising subparagraph (a)(1)(A) as follows:
- 97 "(A) Have been or are hereafter arrested or taken into custody in this state:
- 98 (i) For an offense which is a felony;
- 99 (ii) For an offense which is a misdemeanor or a violation of an ordinance involving 100 burglary tools, commercial gambling, dealing in gambling devices, contributing to the 101 delinquency of a child, dealing in stolen property, dangerous drugs, marijuana, 102 narcotics, firearms, dangerous weapons, explosives, pandering, prostitution, sexual 103 offenses where children are victims, or worthless checks;"

104 PART IV

105 **SECTION 4-1.** 

This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2019, and shall apply to offenses which occur on or after such date. Any offense occurring before July 1, 2019, shall be governed by the law in effect at the time of such offense.

109 **SECTION 4-2.** 

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
