A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Subpart 7 of Part 3 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to grants to children of law enforcement officers, firefighters, and prison guards, so as to provide for tuition grants to spouses of law enforcement officers, firefighters, and prison guards who were killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty; to revise legislative findings; to provide for definitions; to provide for eligibility; to provide for conforming changes; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
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SECTION 1.

Subpart 7 of Part 3 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
Annotated, relating to grants to children of law enforcement officers, firefighters, and prison
guards, is amended by revising Code Section 20-3-450, relating to legislative findings and
purpose of subpart, as follows:

14 "20-3-450.

15 The General Assembly finds that certain citizens are called upon to enforce the criminal 16 laws of this state and to protect persons and properties within the state and that they provide

17 a valuable and vital public service to the state and to citizens and properties within the state 18 at a great personal sacrifice and risk to their own lives and well-being. The purpose of the 19 General Assembly, as provided for in this subpart, is to enable the authority to provide 20 educational grant assistance to the spouses and children of such persons who are killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty." 21 22 **SECTION 2.** 23 Said subpart is further amended in Code Section 20-3-451, relating to definitions, by revising 24 paragraph (3) and by adding new paragraphs to read as follows: 25 "(2.1) 'Eligible student' means a person who qualifies for an educational grant under this 26 subpart. 27 (3) 'Firefighter' means a person employed, appointed, or regularly enrolled by the state or by any county or municipal fire department whose duties include extinguishing fires 28 29 or investigating cases of suspected arson. 30 (3.1) 'In the line of duty' means: 31 (A) With respect to a volunteer firefighter, while on duty and when responding to or 32 returning from a fire or other emergency, performing duties during any fire or other 33 emergency, or performing duties intended to protect life and property, including, 34 without limitation, actual participation in a training exercise; 35 (B) With respect to a law enforcement officer or firefighter, while on duty and 36 performing services for and receiving compensation from the law enforcement or fire 37 service agency which employs such officer or firefighter, while off duty when 38 responding to any situation which would save a life or preserve the peace, or while preventing or attempting to prevent the commission of a crime or fire; or 39 (C) With respect to a prison guard, while on duty and performing services for and 40

41 receiving compensation from the public agency which employs such prison guard."

SECTION 3.

43 Said subpart is further amended by revising Code Section 20-3-453, relating to eligibility of
44 students, as follows:

45 "20-3-453.

46 No grants shall be payable to any person under this subpart who fails to meet any of the47 following qualifications or restrictions:

(1) Such person must shall be the spouse or child, either natural or adopted, of a law
enforcement officer, firefighter, or prison guard who has been permanently disabled or
killed in the line of duty or while performing the duties to which he or she was assigned
in the normal course of employment. If such person is the adopted child of any such law
enforcement officer, firefighter, or prison guard, such person must shall have been
adopted and any final order of adoption issued prior to the date of the accident or event
causing the death or permanent disability of such parent;

55 (2) Such person must shall have been a citizen of this state for a period of at least 12
56 months immediately prior to the date of registration in an approved school and must shall
57 remain a citizen of the this state while receiving funds under this subpart;

(3) The deceased or disabled law enforcement officer, firefighter, or prison guard <u>spouse</u>
or parent of such person must <u>shall</u> have been an employee, either full-time or part-time,
or an officer or official, whether elected or appointed, of this state or any county,
municipality, department, board, bureau, branch, agency, commission, authority, or
political subdivision of the state on the date of the accident or event from which death or
permanent disability resulted; and

64 (4) Any person otherwise meeting the conditions of this subpart shall be eligible to
65 receive a grant even though the accident or the event causing the death or disability of
66 such person's <u>spouse or parent occurred prior to July 1, 1980 2025</u>."

67	SECTION 4.
68	Said subpart is further amended by revising Code Section 20-3-455, relating to
69	administration of program and physical examinations, as follows:
70	"20-3-455.
71	The authority is authorized to prescribe such rules and regulations as may be necessary or
72	convenient for administration of this program and to establish procedures for determination
73	of eligibility of applicants. The authority is also authorized to establish standards and
74	procedures for verifying the death or permanent disability of the applicant's spouse or
75	parent and for such purpose is authorized to require a physical examination and to pay for
76	the cost of such examination from funds appropriated for use by the authority for the
77	purposes of this subpart."
78	SECTION 5.

79 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
