## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and
- 2 businesses, so as to prohibit the practice of conversion therapy; to provide for related matters;
- 3 to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

5 **SECTION 1.** 6 Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses, 7 is amended by adding a new Code section in Chapter 10A, relating to professional 8 counselors, to read as follows: 9 "43-10A-22.1. 10 (a) This Code section shall be known and may be cited as the 'Youth Mental Health 11 Protection Act.' 12 (b) As used in this Code section, the term 'conversion therapy' means any practice or 13 treatment that seeks to change an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity, 14 including efforts to change behaviors or gender expressions or to eliminate or reduce sexual 15 or romantic attractions or feelings toward individuals of the same gender. Conversion 16 therapy shall not include counseling that provides assistance to a person undergoing gender

or facilitates a person's coping, social support, and identity exploration and development, including interventions to prevent or address unlawful conduct or unsafe sexual practices, as long as such counseling is applied neutrally as to a person's sexual orientation and

(c) A person who is authorized to provide counseling under this chapter shall not engage in conversion therapy with a person under 18 years of age. Any instance of engaging in conversion therapy shall be considered unprofessional conduct and shall subject the practitioner to discipline by the appropriate licensing authority."
