A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to alcoholic beverages,
- 2 so as to provide for distillers to sell certain products at retail; to provide for the issuance of
- 3 retail package liquor store licenses to distillers subject to certain conditions; to provide for
- 4 distiller owned food service establishments to be located on or contiguous to the licensed
- 5 premises of a distiller; to provide for the issuance of retail consumption dealer licenses to
- 6 distillers subject to certain conditions; to increase the amount of distilled spirits a distiller
- 7 may provide as part of a free tasting; to provide for definitions; to provide for related matters;
- 8 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

10 SECTION 1.

- 11 Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to alcoholic beverages, is
- 12 amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 13 "3-4-24.2.
- 14 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'barrel' means 53 gallons.
- 15 (b) A distiller licensed in this state may apply to the commissioner for a retail package
- liquor store license. A retail package liquor store license issued to a distiller in this state
- shall be governed by all laws and rules and regulations applicable to retail package liquor
- 18 <u>store licensees, but shall be limited by the following conditions:</u>
- 19 (1) No alcoholic beverages may be sold other than distilled spirits manufactured by the
- 20 <u>distiller on the licensed premises</u>;
- 21 (2) The total amount of retail package sales of distilled spirits for any calendar year shall
- 22 <u>not exceed 10 percent of the total amount of distilled spirits manufactured by the distiller</u>
- in that calendar year or 1,000 barrels, whichever is greater;
- 24 (3) All retail package sales of distilled spirits shall be made on the licensed premises of
- 25 <u>the distiller in an area that is separate from where distilled spirits are manufactured, sales</u>

of alcoholic beverages are offered pursuant to Code Section 3-4-24.3, and separate from

- 27 where free souvenirs or free tastings are offered pursuant to Code Section 3-4-180; and
- 28 (4) All excise taxes shall be collected and paid by the distiller.
- 29 (c) The department shall promulgate and enforce such rules and regulations as it may deem
- 30 necessary to effectuate the provisions of this Code section."

SECTION 2.

- 32 Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 33 "<u>3-4-24.3.</u>
- 34 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'food service establishment' shall have the same
- meaning as provided in Code Section 26-2-370.
- 36 (b) A food service establishment in which a distiller owns or has an ownership interest
- may be located on the licensed premises of a distiller or on property contiguous to such
- 38 premises. A retail consumption dealer license may be issued by the commissioner for such
- food service establishment, provided that such license shall be governed by all laws and
- 40 rules and regulations applicable to retail consumption dealer licensees, but shall be limited
- 41 <u>by the following conditions:</u>
- 42 (1) The food service establishment shall be located in an area that is separate from where
- distilled spirits are manufactured, sales of distilled spirts are offered pursuant to Code
- Section 3-4-24.2, and separate from where free souvenirs or free tastings are offered
- pursuant to Code Section 3-4-180; and
- 46 (2) All excise taxes on distilled spirits manufactured by the distiller that are sold in the
- food service establishment shall be collected and paid by the distiller.
- 48 (c) The department shall promulgate and enforce such rules and regulations as it may deem
- 49 <u>necessary to effectuate the provisions of this Code section.</u>"

SECTION 3.

- 51 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 3-4-180, relating to tastings of
- 52 distilled spirits, definitions, general provisions, prohibited sales, and administration, as
- 53 follows:
- 54 "3-4-180.
- (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 56 (1) 'Distillery tour' means guided access to the manufacturing portion of the licensed
- 57 premises of a distiller.
- 58 (2) 'Free souvenir' means a complimentary sealed container of distilled spirits.
- 59 (3) 'Free tastings' means the provision of complimentary samples of distilled spirits to
- the public for consumption on the premises of a distiller.

- 61 (4) 'Sample' means one-half three-quarters of one ounce of distilled spirits.
- 62 (b)(1) A distiller licensed in this state may apply to the commissioner for an annual
- permit authorizing such distiller to conduct educational and promotional distillery tours
- on the licensed premises of the distiller, free of charge or for a fee, which may include:
- 65 (A) Free souvenirs;
- 66 (B) Free food; and
- 67 (C) Free tastings.
- 68 (2)(A) No distiller providing free souvenirs pursuant to this subsection shall provide,
- directly or indirectly, more than one free souvenir to the same individual in one
- 70 calendar day. Each free souvenir shall be a single bottle of distilled spirits, containing
- 71 not more than 750 milliliters of distilled spirits manufactured by the distiller on the
- 72 licensed premises.
- 73 (B) No distiller conducting free tastings under this Code section shall provide, directly
- or indirectly, more than the three six samples to a person in one calendar day. Free
- tastings shall consist of distilled spirits manufactured by the distiller on the licensed
- premises. Free tastings shall be held in a designated tasting area on the premises of the
- distiller, and all open bottles containing distilled spirits shall be visible at all times.
- 78 (3) Free souvenirs shall only be provided after the distillery tour and only to individuals
- who have attended a distillery tour on the same calendar day. Free tastings and free food
- may be provided before, during, and after a distillery tour. An individual shall be 21
- years of age or older to receive a free souvenir or free tasting.
- 82 (4) The distiller shall pay all excise and use taxes on any samples and all use taxes on
- any free souvenirs provided pursuant to this subsection.
- 84 (c) A distiller may provide to the public free of charge or for a fee merchandise such as
- shirts, glasses, and other promotional items which do not contain alcoholic beverages.
- 86 (d) If a distiller chooses to charge a fee for a distillery tour pursuant to subsection (b) of
- 87 this Code section, such distiller may charge varying fees for the distillery tours, provided
- that such fees are charged prior to the beginning of such tour. The provision of distilled
- spirits by a distiller as part of a distillery tour pursuant to this Code section shall not be
- 90 deemed a retail sale of alcoholic beverages.
- 91 (e) No Except as provided in Code Sections 3-4-24.2 and 2-4-24.3, no alcoholic beverages
- shall be sold on any licensed premises for which a permit has been issued pursuant to this
- 93 Code section.
- 94 (f) The department shall promulgate and enforce such rules and regulations as it may deem
- 95 necessary to effectuate the provisions of this Code section."

97 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
