A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend an Act placing certain of the county officers of Bartow County upon an annual
- 2 salary, approved March 21, 1958 (Ga. L. 1958, p. 2866), as amended, particularly by an Act
- 3 approved March 22, 1990 (Ga. L. 1990, p. 4334), and an Act approved April 26, 2016 (Ga.
- 4 L. 2016, p. 3694), so as to change provisions relating to cost-of-living adjustments to the
- 5 compensation of the clerk of the superior court; to provide longevity increases in the
- 6 compensation of the judge of the probate court; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 7 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 An Act placing certain of the county officers of Bartow County upon an annual salary,
- approved March 21, 1958 (Ga. L. 1958, p. 2866), as amended, particularly by an Act

- 13 L. 2016, p. 3694), is amended by revising paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of Section 3 as
- 14 follows:

"(2) Effective on January 1, 2024, and on the first day of January of each year thereafter,
 the base salary of the clerk of the Superior Court of Bartow County shall be increased
 by 3 percent."

18 SECTION 2.

- 19 Said Act is further amended by adding a new paragraph to subsection (a) of Section 3 to read 20 as follows:
- "(3) The judge of the Probate Court of Bartow County shall also receive a longevity increase determined by multiplying the total amount calculated under paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection by the percentage which equals 5 percent times the number of completed four-year terms of office served by such judge after January 1, 2024, effective on the first day of January following the compilation of each such completed four-year term of office."

SECTION 3.

28 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
