The Senate Committee on Health and Human Services offered the following substitute to HB 647:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 2 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Department of Community Health, so as to provide for a pilot program to provide coverage for the treatment and management of obesity and related conditions, including medications and counseling; to provide a definition; to provide for eligibility; to provide for requirements; to provide for a review of results and outcomes; to provide for an evaluation report on such program; to provide for termination of the pilot program; to provide for automatic repeal; to provide for related matters; to provide for contingent effectiveness; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

11 Chapter 2 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Department 12 of Community Health, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

"<u>31-2-15.</u>

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- (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'state health insurance plan' means:
- 15 (1) The state employees' health insurance plan established pursuant to Article 1 of Chapter 18 of Title 45;
 - (2) The health insurance plan for public school teachers established pursuant to Subpart 2 of Part 6 of Article 17 of Chapter 2 of Title 20; and
 - (3) The health insurance plan for public school employees established pursuant to Subpart 3 of Part 6 of Article 17 of Chapter 2 of Title 20.
 - (b) Beginning six months after the effective date of this Code section, the department shall conduct a two-year pilot program to provide coverage for the treatment and management of obesity and related conditions under a state health insurance plan. The department shall be authorized to enter into an agreement with a postsecondary institution in this state for pilot program management, data collection, patient engagement, and other activities related to the pilot program. The pilot program will provide coverage of all federal Food and Drug

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27 Administration approved medications for chronic weight management for eligible 28 participants in conjunction with obesity prevention, screening, and counseling benefits. 29 (c) Participation in the pilot program shall be limited to no more than 500 individuals per 30 year, to be selected in a manner determined by the department. 31 (d) Any person who has elected coverage under a state health insurance plan shall be 32 eligible to be selected to participate in the pilot program in accordance with criteria 33 established by the department which shall include, but not be limited to: 34 (1) Completion of a health risk assessment through a state health insurance plan; 35 (2) A body mass index: 36 (A) Greater than or equal to 27 with comorbidities related to obesity; or 37 (B) Greater than or equal to 30 without such comorbidities. 38 (3) Consent to provide personal and medical information to a state health insurance plan; 39 <u>and</u> 40 (4) An agreement to enroll in a department approved wellness program during the plan 41 <u>year.</u> 42 (e) Eligible individuals must apply to participate in the pilot program. The individual and 43 his or her physician shall complete and submit an obesity treatment program application 44 to the department no later than February 1 for each year of the pilot program. The 45 department's contracted health insurance carrier shall review the applications and based on 46 the criteria contained in subsection (d) of this Code section, shall determine qualified 47 applicants for the pilot program. 48 (f) All health care services provided pursuant to the pilot program shall be subject to the 49 health insurance carrier's plan of benefits and policy provisions.
