

The Senate Committee on Education and Youth offered the following substitute to HB 681:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Part 14 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
2 Annotated, relating to other educational programs under the "Quality Basic Education Act,"
3 so as to authorize home study students in grades six through 12 to participate in
4 extracurricular and interscholastic activities in the student's resident public school system;
5 to provide that home study students shall complete one qualifying course facilitated by the
6 resident school system for each semester of the regular school year during any part of which
7 the home study student participates in an extracurricular or interscholastic activity; to provide
8 for eligibility requirements; to provide for participation at a particular public school; to
9 provide for participation fees; to provide for definitions; to amend Code Section 20-2-690
10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to educational entities and requirements
11 for private schools and home study programs, so as to provide parents and guardians
12 authority to execute documents for verification purposes; to provide for a short title; to
13 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

15 **SECTION 1.**

16 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Dexter Mosely Act."

SECTION 2.

18 Part 14 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
19 relating to other educational programs under the "Quality Basic Education Act," is amended
20 by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

21 "20-2-319.6.

22 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:

23 (1) 'Athletic association' means any association of schools or any other similar
24 organization which acts as an organizing, sanctioning, scheduling, or rule-making body
25 for interscholastic activities in which public schools in this state participate.

26 (2) 'Extracurricular activities' means public school-sponsored activities in which students
27 take part on a voluntary basis; which do not offer or provide school or course credits;
28 which are generally conducted outside regular school hours or, if conducted in whole or
29 in part during regular school hours, at times agreed to by the participants and approved
30 by a school official; and which are managed and operated under the guidance of a
31 teacher, other school employee, or other adult approved by a school official. Examples
32 of extracurricular activities include but are not limited to intramural and interscholastic
33 athletics; band, chorus, and other musical activities; drama and other theatrical activities;
34 and clubs and organizations as defined in subsection (a) of Code Section 20-2-705.

35 (3) 'Home study student' means any student in grades six through 12 who is in a home
36 study program that meets the requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690.

37 (4) 'Interscholastic activities' means extracurricular activities, public school-sponsored
38 athletic programs, and other public school-sponsored programs that are sanctioned or
39 supported by a state-wide interscholastic activities governing body, including but not
40 limited to an athletic association.

41 (5) 'Qualifying course' means a course facilitated by the home study student's resident
42 school system:

43 (A) By applying one or more of the mechanisms provided for in paragraphs (1)
44 through (4) of subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-319.4;

45 (B) By way of a dual credit course as provided for in Code Section 20-2-161.3; or

46 (C) By way of an on-site course required for participation in designated extracurricular
47 and interscholastic activities.

48 (6) 'Resident school' means the public school in which a home study student would be
49 enrolled based on his or her residence.

50 (7) 'Resident school system' means the public school system in which a home study
51 student would be enrolled based on his or her residence.

52 (b) A home study student shall be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities and
53 interscholastic activities under the sponsorship, direction, and control of the resident school
54 or resident school system, provided that each of the following requirements is met:

55 (1) At least 30 calendar days before the first school day of the semester in which a home
56 study student will enroll in a qualifying course as provided in paragraph (2) of this
57 subsection, a parent or guardian of the home study student provides to the principal of the
58 resident school and the superintendent of the resident school system:

59 (A) Written notice that the home study student intends to participate in one or more
60 specified extracurricular or interscholastic activities as a representative of the resident
61 school or resident school system; and

62 (B) A copy of the home study student's most recent annual progress assessment report,
63 as provided for in paragraph (8) of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690, along with
64 written verification by the home study program instructor that the home study student
65 is currently receiving a passing grade in each home study program course, is
66 maintaining satisfactory progress toward advancement, and meets the requirements for
67 participation in the specified extracurricular or interscholastic activity;

68 (2) For each semester of the regular school year during any part of which the home study
69 student participates in an extracurricular or interscholastic activity, the home study
70 student enrolls in and attempts to complete one qualifying course;

71 (3) The home study student meets established age, academic, behavioral, conduct,
72 disciplinary, residence, zoning, and other rules and requirements applicable to all students
73 for participation in the specified extracurricular or interscholastic activity and provides
74 any supporting documentation required by the resident school;

75 (4) The home study student abides by the same student code of conduct and disciplinary
76 measures and transportation policies as students enrolled at the resident school who are
77 participating in the same extracurricular or interscholastic activity as the home study
78 student;

79 (5) The home study student completes the tryout process or the equivalent for
80 participation in the specified extracurricular or interscholastic activity applicable to all
81 students for participation in the specified extracurricular or interscholastic activity and
82 provides any supporting documentation required by the resident school; and

83 (6) For an extracurricular or interscholastic activity which involves a competitive
84 selection process, the home study student is selected.

85 (c) A student who withdraws from a public school to participate in a home study program
86 shall be ineligible for participation in any extracurricular or interscholastic activity for 12
87 months from the date of the declaration of intent to utilize a home study program provided
88 to the Department of Education as provided under paragraph (2) of subsection (c) of Code
89 Section 20-2-690.

90 (d) For purposes of this Code section, participation in an extracurricular or interscholastic
91 activity includes participation in the following school-sponsored activities related to the
92 extracurricular or interscholastic activity: tryouts; off-season practice, rehearsal, or
93 conditioning; summer and holiday practice, rehearsal, or conditioning; in-season practice,

94 rehearsal, or conditioning; and all exhibitions, contests, and competitions, including
95 scrimmage, preseason, regular season, postseason, and invitational.

96 (e) A resident school, a resident school system, or an athletic association shall not deny a
97 home study student the opportunity to try out and participate if selected in any
98 extracurricular or interscholastic activities available at the resident school or in the resident
99 school system if the student meets the requirements contained in subsection (b) of this
100 Code section and is not ineligible under subsection (c) of this Code section.

101 (f) No public high school which receives funding under this article shall participate in,
102 sponsor, or provide coaching staff for interscholastic activities which are conducted under
103 the authority of, conducted under the rules of, or scheduled by any athletic association that
104 does not deem eligible for participation a home study student who meets the requirements
105 contained in subsection (b) of this Code section and is not ineligible under subsection (c)
106 of this Code section.

107 (g) Home study students shall participate in extracurricular or interscholastic activities on
108 behalf of such home study student's resident school.

109 (h) The specific assigned program of each home study student enrolled in a qualifying
110 course shall be included for a one-sixth segment of the school day, or the block scheduling
111 equivalent, by the home study student's resident school system in reports made to the
112 Department of Education as provided in subsection (a) of Code Section 20-2-160."

SECTION 3.

114 Code Section 20-2-690 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to educational
115 entities and requirements for private schools and home study programs, is amended by
116 revising paragraph (6) of subsection (c) as follows:

117 "(6) The parent or guardian shall have the authority to execute any document required
118 by law, rule, regulation, or policy to evidence the enrollment of a child in a home study
119 program, the student's full-time or part-time status, the student's grades, or any other

120 required educational information. This shall include, but not be limited to, documents for
121 purposes of verification of enrollment by the Department of Driver Services, for the
122 purposes set forth in subsection (a.1) of Code Section 40-5-22, documents required
123 pursuant to Chapter 2 of Title 39 relating to employment of minors, documents for
124 purposes of verification as set forth in subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-319.6, and any
125 documents required to apply for the receipt of state or federal public assistance;"

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SECTION 4.

127 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
