## House Bill 690 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE) By: Representative Carter of the 175<sup>th</sup>

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Part 5 of Article 8 of Chapter 2 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia 1 2 Annotated, relating to membership of certain law enforcement officers in the Employees' Retirement System of Georgia, so as to provide that certain law enforcement officers may 3 obtain creditable service in such retirement system under certain conditions; to define a 4 5 certain term; to provide for the payment of the full actuarial value of obtaining such creditable service; to provide for application; to provide for related matters; to provide 6 conditions for an effective date and automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 7 8 purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

10	SECTION 1.
11	Part 5 of Article 8 of Chapter 2 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
12	relating to membership of certain law enforcement officers in the Employees' Retirement
13	System of Georgia, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
14	″ <u>47-2-226.</u>
15	(a) As used in this Code section, the term 'law enforcement officer' means any member in
16	service of the Uniform Division of the Department of Public Safety, any conservation
17	ranger of the Department of Natural Resources, any officer or agent of the Georgia Bureau
18	of Investigation, any district attorney investigator who is compensated from state funds
19	pursuant to Code Section 15-18-14.1, and any alcohol and tobacco officer or agent of the
20	Department of Revenue.
21	(b) Any law enforcement officer who, prior to becoming a member of this retirement
22	system, was employed by a local government as a full-time employee, in a position in
23	which he or she was vested with authority to enforce the criminal or traffic laws and with
24	the power of arrest and whose duties include the preservation of public order, the protection
25	of life and property, or the prevention, detection, or investigation of crime, shall be eligible
26	to obtain creditable service under this Code section if:

27 (1) The member was not eligible for a defined benefit or defined contribution retirement or pension plan while employed by the local governing authority other than membership 28 29 in the Peace Officers' Annuity and Benefit Fund; and 30 (2) The member has been a member of the retirement system for at least ten years. (c) Any member eligible as provided in subsection (b) of this Code section may obtain up 31 32 to an additional five years of creditable service, not to exceed the actual number of years 33 of service described in subsection (b) of this Code section. In order to obtain such additional creditable service, the member shall: 34 35 (1) Make application to the board of trustees in such manner and provide such 36 documentation as the board deems appropriate; and 37 (2) Pay to the board of trustees an amount determined by the board of trustees to be 38 sufficient to cover the full actuarial cost of granting the creditable service as provided in 39 this Code section. 40 (d) Upon receipt of an application for additional creditable service, the board of trustees 41 shall certify to the applicant the amount of the payment required by paragraph (2) of subsection (c) of this Code section." 42 43 **SECTION 2.** 

This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2016, only if it is determined to have been concurrently funded as provided in Chapter 20 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, the "Public Retirement Systems Standards Law"; otherwise, this Act shall not become effective and shall be automatically repealed in its entirety on July 1, 2016, as required by subsection (a) of Code Section 47-20-50.
