A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 4A of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to community involvement in elementary and secondary education, so as to provide
- 3 for a system of determining parental investment in public schools; to provide for legislative
- 4 findings and intent; to provide for the establishment of rules and regulations by the State
- 5 Board of Education for the determination of parental investment letter grades; to provide that
- 6 local school systems may elect to participate in the parental investment grading system; to
- 7 provide for limited liability; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 8 other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 Article 4A of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 12 community involvement in elementary and secondary education, is amended by adding a
- 13 new Code section to read as follows:
- 14 "20-2-87.
- 15 (a)(1) The General Assembly finds and declares that:
- 16 (A) The role of parents in preparing and supporting their children is of critical
- importance to the success of each child's experience in public education;
- 18 (B) Despite general agreement about the importance of preparation and support, it is
- clear that little is known about the interrelation of such parental investments with
- 20 <u>aggregate student performance or about the general quality of parental investment being</u>
- 21 provided; and
- 22 (C) It is unclear as to whether many parents are even aware of the value of their role
- in the potential success of their children in school.
- 24 (2) The General Assembly therefore intends to create a system whereby such parental
- 25 <u>investment can be measured and evaluated, and the results of such measurement and</u>
- 26 <u>evaluation shall be communicated back to parents.</u>

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27 (b) The State Board of Education shall, by the beginning of the 2015-2016 school year,

- 28 promulgate rules and regulations to establish a parental investment grading system for the
- 29 <u>collection and evaluation of parental investment data. The rules and regulations shall:</u>
- 30 (1) Include a standardized framework for the collection and reporting of parental
- 31 <u>investment data, including the computation of a letter grade of A, B, C, or F for the</u>
- 32 parents or guardians of each student;
- 33 (2) Include a system for relating aggregate parental investment data to system-wide and
- 34 <u>state-wide student performance;</u>
- 35 (3) Include a method to determine parental investment letter grades based upon, at a
- 36 minimum, the following factors:
- 37 (A) The return of school correspondence by parents or guardians requiring a response
- 38 <u>or signature;</u>
- 39 (B) The attendance of the parent or guardian at parent/teacher conferences;
- 40 (C) The student's completion of homework;
- 41 (D) The frequency of the student's tardiness and unexcused absences; and
- 42 (E) For students who first begin attendance in a Georgia school system in pre-
- 43 <u>kindergarten, kindergarten, or first grade, an evaluation of the student's knowledge of</u>
- 44 <u>colors, shapes, letters, and numbers at the beginning of the first year of such student's</u>
- 45 <u>attendance</u>;
- 46 (4) Include a mechanism for the transfer of parental investment data among local school
- 47 <u>systems for students who transfer to another school system; and</u>
- 48 (5) Prohibit the release of specific parental investment data and letter grades for each
- 49 <u>student's parents or guardians except to such parents or guardians. The use of parental</u>
- 50 investment data and letter grades in relating aggregate parental investment data to
- 51 system-wide and state-wide student performance shall utilize only aggregate parental
- 52 <u>investment data, and no identifying data shall be released.</u>
- 53 (c)(1) A local school system may, upon majority resolution of the local board of
- 54 <u>education, participate in the parental investment grading system.</u>
- 55 (2) Participating school systems shall provide the parental investment letter grade to
- 56 parents and guardians with their child's report card at each reporting cycle. Such
- 57 participating school systems may report their aggregate student performance data in a
- 58 manner that relates their aggregate parental investment data to local school system
- 59 <u>student performance data, as provided for in paragraph (2) of subsection (b) of this Code</u>
- section.
- 61 (3) The parental investment letter grade may include a disclaimer stating that the
- 62 computation of such letter grade is based solely upon rules and regulations promulgated

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63	by the State Board of Education pursuant to this Code section and that the child's
64	teachers, school administrators, and local school system have no discretion in
65	determining such letter grade.
66	(4) Participating school systems may use parental investment data in the process of
67	teacher evaluation and promotion.
68	(d) The state and participating school systems shall not be liable for a violation of any
69	individual rights for the collection of parental investment data or for participation in the
70	parental investment grading system."

71 **SECTION 2.**

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
