A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 4 of Chapter 9 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to fraud and related practices, so as to provide that it shall be unlawful for a person with intent to hinder, delay, impair, or defraud a creditor's rights to deed or otherwise transfer title to real property to another person without the knowledge or consent of such other person; to provide for sanctions; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

9 Article 4 of Chapter 9 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to fraud
10 and related practices, is amended by revising Code Section 16-9-51, relating to destruction,
11 removal, concealment, encumbrance, or transfer of property subject to security interest, as
12 follows:

13 *"*16-9-51.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this Code section, a person who destroys,
 removes, conceals, encumbers, transfers, or otherwise deals with property subject to a

- security interest with intent to hinder enforcement of that <u>such</u> interest shall be guilty of a
 misdemeanor.
- 18 (b) A person who destroys, removes, conceals, encumbers, transfers, or otherwise deals
- 19 with property subject to a security interest with intent to hinder enforcement of that such
- 20 security interest and in so doing does damage to such property in an amount greater than
- 21 \$500.00 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature.
- 22 (c) A person with intent to hinder, delay, impair, or defraud a creditor's rights who deeds
- 23 or otherwise transfers title to real property to another person without the knowledge or
- 24 <u>consent of such other person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.</u>
- (c)(d) In a prosecution under this Code section the crime shall be considered as having
- 26 been committed in any county where any act in furtherance of the criminal scheme was
- done or <u>was</u> caused to be done."
