A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To provide a homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for county 2 purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the current year assessed value of a 3 homestead exceeds the base year assessed value of such homestead for residents of that 4 county who are 65 years of age or older; to provide for definitions; to specify the terms and 5 conditions of the exemption and the procedures relating thereto; to provide for applicability; 6 to provide for compliance with constitutional requirements; to provide for a referendum, 7 effective dates, automatic repeal, mandatory execution of election, and judicial remedies 8 regarding failure to comply; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

11 (a) As used in this Act, the term:

(1) "Ad valorem taxes for county purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for county
purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of Oconee County, including, but not limited to, any
ad valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire county bonded indebtedness.

15 (2) "Base year" means:

16 (A) The first year that a resident received:

(i) The homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for county
purposes for certain residents of that county who have annual incomes not exceeding
\$15,000.00 and who are 65 years of age or over provided for in Ga. L. 1998, p. 3576;
(ii) The homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for the full
value of the homestead for residents of that county who are 65 years of age or over
and whose gross household income does not exceed \$40,000.00 provided for in
Ga. L. 2006, p. 4127; or

(iii) The homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for the full
value of the homestead for residents of that county who are 65 years of age or over
and whose gross household income exceeds \$40,000.00 provided for in
Ga. L. 2006, p. 4132; or

(B) The taxable year immediately preceding the taxable year in which the exemption
under subsection (b) of this section is first granted to the most recent owner of such
homestead.

31 (3) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of
32 the O.C.G.A., as amended.

33 (b) Each resident of Oconee County who is 65 years of age or older is granted an exemption 34 on that person's homestead from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for county purposes in an 35 amount equal to the amount by which the current year assessed value of that homestead 36 exceeds the base year assessed value, including any final determination of value on appeal 37 pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, of that homestead. This 38 exemption shall not apply to taxes assessed on improvements to such homestead or 39 additional land that is added to such homestead after January 1 of the base year. If any real 40 property is removed from such homestead, the base year assessed value, including any final 41 determination of value on appeal pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as 42 amended, shall be adjusted to reflect such removal, and the exemption shall be recalculated 43 accordingly. The value of that property in excess of such exempted amount shall remain44 subject to taxation.

45 (c) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section unless such person or person's agent files an application with the tax commissioner 46 47 of Oconee County, giving such information relative to receiving such exemption as will 48 enable the tax commissioner of Oconee County to make a determination regarding the initial 49 and continuing eligibility of such person for such exemption; provided, however, that any 50 person who applied for and received one of the exemptions listed in subparagraph (a)(2)(A)51 of this section shall automatically receive the exemption provided for in this section without 52 needing to apply for it as provided for in this subsection. The tax commissioner of Oconee 53 County shall provide application forms for this purpose.

54 (d) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of 55 the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year 56 so long as the person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b) of this section 57 occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the proper application as 58 provided in subsection (c) of this section, it shall not be necessary to make application 59 thereafter for any year, and the exemption shall continue to be allowed to such person. It 60 shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b) of this 61 section to notify the tax commissioner of Oconee County in the event that such person for 62 any reason becomes ineligible for such exemption.

(e) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to or affect any
state ad valorem taxes, county or independent school district ad valorem taxes for educational
purposes, or municipal ad valorem taxes for municipal purposes. The homestead exemption
granted by subsection (b) of this section shall be in addition to and not in lieu of any other
homestead exemption applicable to Oconee County ad valorem taxes for county purposes.
(f) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall apply to all taxable years
beginning on or after January 1, 2025.

71	In accordance with the requirements of Article VII, Section II of the Constitution of the State	
72	of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the requisite two-thirds' majority	
73	vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

75	The election superintendent of Oconee County shall call and conduct an election	as provided
76	in this section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of Oconee County for	
77	approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that election on	the date of
78	the general primary in 2024 and shall issue the call and conduct that election as provided by	
79	general law. The election superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of the election to	
80	be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding the date thereof in the

121 Section 1 of this Act shall become of full force and effect on January 1, 2025. If the Act, or any one of the Acts provided for in paragraphs (1) through (9) of this section are not so 122 123 approved or if the election on the Act or any of the Acts provided for in paragraphs (1) through (9) of this section is not conducted as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act 124 125 shall not become effective, and this Act shall be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following that election date. The expense of such election shall be 126 127 borne by Oconee County. It shall be the election superintendent's duty to certify the result 128 thereof to the Secretary of State. The provisions of this section shall be mandatory upon the election superintendent and are not intended as directory. If the election superintendent fails 129 130 or refuses to comply with this section, any elector of Oconee County may apply for a writ 131 of mandamus to compel the election superintendent to perform his or her duties under this 132 section. If the court finds that the election superintendent has not complied with this section, the court shall fashion appropriate relief requiring the election superintendent to call and 133 134 conduct such election on the date required by this section or on the next date authorized for special elections provided for in Code Section 21-2-540 of the O.C.G.A. 135

SECTION 4.

Except as otherwise provided in Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon
its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval, provided that:
(1) An Act to provide a \$3,000.00 exemption from Oconee County school district ad
valorem taxes for educational purposes, with an automatic increase of such exemption
to \$8,000.00 on January 1, 2035;

(2) An Act to provide a \$3,000.00 exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for
county purposes, with an automatic increase of such exemption to \$8,000.00 on
January 1, 2035;

(3) An Act to repeal the homestead exemption granted from Oconee County school
district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes to certain residents of that school
district, approved March 27, 1998 (Ga. L. 1998, p. 3568);

(4) An Act to repeal the homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes
for county purposes for certain residents of that county who are 65 years of age or over,
approved March 27, 1998 (Ga. L. 1998, p. 3576);

(5) An Act to repeal the homestead exemption granted from Oconee County ad valorem
taxes to certain residents of that county, approved May 4, 2006 (Ga. L. 2006, p. 4132);
(6) An Act to close to new applications the homestead exemption granted from Oconee
County ad valorem taxes to certain residents of that county, approved May 4, 2006
(Ga. L. 2006, p. 4127);

(7) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County school district ad
valorem taxes for educational purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the
current year assessed value of the homestead exceeds the base year assessed value of such
homestead for residents of that county who are 65 years of age or older;

(8) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for
county purposes in the amount of \$10,000.00 for residents of that county who are 75
years of age or older; and

(9) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County school district ad
valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$10,000.00 for residents of that
county who are 75 years of age or older

are enacted in the 2023 regular session of the General Assembly. If each such Act is not so
enacted, this Act shall not become effective and shall be automatically repealed on
January 1, 2025.
