A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 6 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to general provisions regarding uniform rules of the road, so as to add utility service
- 3 vehicles to the "Spencer Pass Law"; to provide a procedure for passing stationary utility
- 4 service vehicles; to provide for definitions; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 1 of Chapter 6 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 general provisions regarding uniform rules of the road, is amended in Code Section 40-6-16,
- 10 relating to the "Spencer Pass Law" and procedure for passing stationary authorized
- 11 emergency vehicles, stationary towing or recovery vehicles, or stationary highway
- maintenance vehicles, by revising subsection (c) and by adding a new subsection to read as
- 13 follows:

- 14 "(c) The operator of a motor vehicle approaching a stationary towing or recovery vehicle,
- or a stationary highway maintenance vehicle, or a stationary utility service vehicle that is
- 16 <u>utilizing traffic cones or</u> displaying flashing yellow, amber, or red lights shall approach the
- 17 vehicle with due caution and shall, absent any other direction by a peace officer, proceed
- as follows:
- 19 (1) Make a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the towing, recovery, or highway
- 20 maintenance, or utility service vehicle if possible in the existing safety and traffic
- 21 conditions; or
- 22 (2) If a lane change under paragraph (1) of this subsection would be impossible,
- prohibited by law, or unsafe, reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a reasonable and
- proper speed for the existing road and traffic conditions, which speed shall be less than
- 25 the posted speed limit, and be prepared to stop."
- 26 "(e) As used in this Code section, the term:

27	(1) 'Utility service vehicle' means any vehicle being used by an employee or contractor
21	(1) Ctility service veinere means any veinere being used by an employee of contractor
28	of any entity, including, but not limited to, a political subdivision of this state or a local
29	authority or commission related thereto, an electric cooperative, or a public or private
30	corporation, in connection with the provision of utility services.
31	(2) 'Utility services' means and includes electric, natural gas, water, waste-water, cable,
32	sanitation, telephone, or telecommunication services or the repair, location, relocation,
33	improvement, or maintenance of utility poles, transmission structures, pipes, wires, fibers,
34	cables, easements, rights of way, and associated infrastructure."
