## House Bill 767 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To provide a homestead exemption from Oconee County school district ad valorem taxes for
- 2 educational purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the current year assessed
- 3 value of a homestead exceeds the base year assessed value of such homestead for residents
- 4 of that county who are 65 years of age or over; to provide for definitions; to specify the terms
- 5 and conditions of the exemption and the procedures relating thereto; to provide for
- 6 applicability; to provide for compliance with constitutional requirements; to provide for a
- 7 referendum, effective dates, automatic repeal, mandatory execution of election, and judicial
- 8 remedies regarding failure to comply; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 (a) As used in this Act, the term:
- 12 (1) "Ad valorem taxes for educational purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for
- educational purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of the Oconee County school district,
- including, but not limited to, any ad valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire county
- school district bonded indebtedness.
- 16 (2) "Base year" means:

- 17 (A) The first year that a resident received:
- 18 (i) The homestead exemption from Oconee County School District ad valorem taxes
- 19 for educational purposes for certain residents of that county who have annual incomes
- 20 not exceeding \$15,000.00 and who are 65 years of age or over, provided for in
- 21 Ga. L. 1998, p. 3568;
- 22 (ii) The homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for the full
- value of the homestead for residents of the county who are 65 years of age or over and
- 24 whose gross household income does not exceed \$40,000.00, provided for in
- 25 Ga. L. 2006, p. 4127; or
- 26 (iii) The homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for the full
- value of the homestead for residents of the county who are 65 years of age or over and
- 28 whose gross household income exceeds \$40,000.00, provided for in
- 29 Ga. L. 2006, p. 4132; or
- 30 (B) The taxable year immediately preceding the taxable year in which the exemption
- 31 under subsection (b) of this section is first granted to the most recent owner of such
- 32 homestead.
- 33 (3) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of
- the O.C.G.A., as amended.
- 35 (b) Each resident of the Oconee County school district is granted an exemption on that
- 36 person's homestead from Oconee County school district ad valorem taxes for educational
- purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the current year assessed value of that
- 38 homestead exceeds the base year assessed value of such homestead, including any final
- 39 determination of value on appeal, pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as
- 40 amended, of the homestead. This exemption shall not apply to taxes assessed on
- 41 improvements to such homestead or additional land that is added to such homestead after
- 42 January 1 of the base year. If any real property is removed from such homestead, the base
- 43 year assessed value, including any final determination of value on appeal pursuant to Code

44 Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, shall be adjusted to reflect such removal, and 45 the exemption shall be recalculated accordingly. The value of that property in excess of such 46 exempted amount shall remain subject to taxation. (c) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this 47 48 section unless such person or person's agent files an application with the tax commissioner 49 of Oconee County, giving such information relative to receiving such exemption as will enable the tax commissioner of Oconee County to make a determination regarding the initial 50 51 and continuing eligibility of such person for such exemption; provided, however, that any 52 person who has applied for and received one of the exemptions listed in subparagraph (A) 53 of paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of this section shall automatically receive the exemption 54 provided for in this Act without needing to make such an application. The tax commissioner 55 of Oconee County shall provide application forms for this purpose. 56 (d) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of 57 the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year 58 so long as the person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b) of this section 59 occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the proper application as 60 provided in subsection (c) of this section, it shall not be necessary to make application 61 thereafter for any year, and the exemption shall continue to be allowed to such person. It 62 shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b) of this 63 section to notify the tax commissioner of Oconee County in the event that such person for 64 any reason becomes ineligible for such exemption. (e) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to or affect any 65 66 state ad valorem taxes, county ad valorem taxes for county purposes, municipal ad valorem 67 taxes for municipal purposes, or independent school district ad valorem taxes for educational 68 purposes. The homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall be in 69 addition to and not in lieu of any other homestead exemption applicable to Oconee County

school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes.

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71 (f) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall apply to all taxable years

72 beginning on or after January 1, 2025.

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73 SECTION 2.

In accordance with the requirements of Article VII, Section II of the Constitution of the State

of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the requisite two-thirds' majority

vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

77 SECTION 3.

The election superintendent of Oconee County shall call and conduct an election as provided in this section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Oconee County school district for approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that election on the date of the general primary in 2024 and shall issue the call and conduct that election as provided by general law. The election superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of the election to be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding the date thereof in the official organ of Oconee County. The ballot shall have written or printed thereon the words:

86 "( ) YES Shall the Act be approved which provides to residents 65 years of age or 87 older a homestead exemption from Oconee County school district ad 88 ( ) NO valorem taxes for educational purposes in an amount equal to the amount 89 by which the current year assessed value of a homestead exceeds the base 90 year assessed value, including any final determination of value on appeal 91 pursuant to Code Section 48-5-311 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, of such 92 homestead, provided that all of the other homestead exemption questions on 93 the ballot are approved?"

All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and all persons desiring to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes cast on

such question are for approval of this Act, and more than one-half of the votes cast on each
