- 3 Miller Scholarships for home study students who receive certain scores on standardized
- 4 college admission tests; to revise eligibility requirements for HOPE scholarships for entering
- 5 freshmen students who are home study students regarding scores on standardized college
- 6 admission tests; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 7 purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

10 Part 7 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,

relating to HOPE scholarships and grants, is amended in Code Section 20-3-519, relating to

SECTION 1.

- definitions, by revising paragraph (27) as follows:
- 13 "(27) 'Zell Miller Scholarship Scholar' means a student who has met the applicable
- eligibility requirements to receive a HOPE scholarship in accordance with Code Section
- 15 20-3-519.2 and:
- 16 (A) As an incoming freshman:
- 17 (i) Having graduated from an eligible high school with a grade point average of at
- least 3.7 calculated in accordance with Code Section 20-2-157 and having received
- a score of at least 1,200 combined critical reading score and math score on a single
- administration of the SAT or an ACT composite scale score of at least 26;
- 21 (ii) Having graduated from an eligible high school as a valedictorian or salutatorian;
- 22 or
- 23 (iii) Having completed a home study program meeting the requirements of subsection
- 24 (c) of Code Section 20-2-690, having received a score of at least 1,350 combined
- 25 <u>critical reading score and math score on a single administration of the SAT or an ACT</u>
- 26 <u>composite scale score of at least 29; or</u>

(iii)(iv) Having completed a home study program meeting the requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690, having received a score of at least 1,200 combined critical reading score and math score on a single administration of the SAT or an ACT composite scale score of at least 26, and earning a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.3 at an eligible postsecondary institution at the end of the quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 45 quarter hours or 30 semester hours, provided that such student shall be eligible to receive a retroactive scholarship for such student's freshman year to be paid at the end of the freshman year; and

(B) As a sophomore, junior, senior, or first professional student who met the requirements of subparagraph (A) of this paragraph, having a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.3 at the checkpoints set forth in paragraph (1) of subsection (b) of Code Section 20-3-519.2. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a student who entered an eligible postsecondary institution as a freshman between July 1, 2007, and June 30, 2011, and met the requirements of subparagraph (A) of this paragraph may become a Zell Miller Scholarship Scholar as a sophomore, junior, senior, or first professional student.

A student who loses eligibility to be a Zell Miller Scholarship Scholar for any reason may regain eligibility one time if the student requalifies at one of the checkpoints set forth in paragraph (1) of subsection (b) of Code Section 20-3-519.2."

and Adult Education, now known as the Technical College System of Georgia, after 63 June 30, 1993, provided that such student shall only be eligible for a HOPE 64 scholarship pursuant to subsection (c) of this Code section; 65 66 (ii) Completed a home study program meeting the requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690 in lieu of graduating from an eligible high school, earning a 67 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at an eligible postsecondary institution 68 69 at the end of the quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 45 quarter hours or 30 semester hours, provided that such student shall be eligible to receive a 70 71 retroactive HOPE scholarship for such student's freshman year to be paid at the end 72 of the freshman year; or 73 (iii) Graduated from a high school which is not an eligible high school, earning a 74 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at an eligible postsecondary institution 75 at the end of the quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 45 quarter 76 hours or 30 semester hours, provided that such student shall be eligible to receive a 77 retroactive HOPE scholarship for such student's freshman year to be paid at the end 78 of the freshman year; or 79 (C) In the case of an otherwise qualified student who: 80 (i) Did not graduate from high school or complete a home study program meeting the 81 requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690 but received the general 82 educational development (GED) diploma awarded by the Department of Technical 83 and Adult Education, now known as the Technical College System of Georgia, after 84 June 30, 1993; or 85 (ii) Completed a home study program meeting the requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690 in lieu of graduating from an eligible high school; or 86 87 (iii)(iii) Graduated from a high school which is not an eligible high school, 88 earning a score in the eightieth percentile or higher nationally on a standardized college admission test, such as the SAT or ACT; and or 89 (D) In the case of an otherwise qualified student who completed a home study program 90

(D) In the case of an otherwise qualified student who completed a home study program meeting the requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690 in lieu of graduating from an eligible high school, earning a score in the seventy-fifth percentile or higher nationally on a standardized college admission test, such as the SAT or ACT; and

(2) Meet enrollment standards by being admitted, enrolled, and classified as an undergraduate student in a matriculated status."
