A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 43-50-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 definitions relative to veterinarians and veterinary technicians, so as to clarify the scope of
- 3 the veterinarian-client-patient relationship; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Code Section 43-50-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to definitions
- 8 relative to veterinarians and veterinary technicians, is amended by revising paragraph (15)
- 9 as follows:

- 10 "(15) 'Veterinarian-client-patient relationship' means that:
- 11 (A) The licensed veterinarian or his or her licensed designee has assumed the
- responsibility for making medical judgments regarding the health of the animal and the
- need for medical treatment, and the client (owner or caretaker) has agreed to follow the
- instruction of the licensed veterinarian;
- 15 (B) There is sufficient knowledge of the animal by the licensed veterinarian to initiate
- at least a general or preliminary diagnosis of the medical condition of the animal. This
- means that the licensed veterinarian has recently seen and is personally acquainted with
- the keeping and care of the animal by the virtue of examination of the animal or by
- medically appropriate and timely visits to the premises where the animal is kept <u>or by</u>
- 20 <u>medically appropriate and timely visits by the licensed veterinarian to premises within</u>

an operation or production system where the animal or groups of animals are kept; and

- (C) A licensed veterinarian is readily available for follow up in the case of adverse
- reactions or failure of the regimen of therapy."

SECTION 2.

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
