A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 3 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Teachers Retirement System of Georgia, so as to provide for creditable service in the retirement system for certain members based on their teaching service outside this state while married to active duty members of the United States armed forces; to provide for terms and conditions; to provide for related matters; to define "external teaching service"; to provide conditions for an effective date and automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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SECTION 1.

Chapter 3 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Teachers
Retirement System of Georgia, is amended by revising Code Section 47-3-89, relating to
credit for service rendered in governmentally supported or operated schools other than public
schools in Georgia and payments required to obtain credit for such service, as follows:
"47-3-89.

 ⁽a) Any member of the retirement system shall be entitled to receive up to ten years of
 creditable service for <u>As used in this Code section</u>, 'external teaching service' means

22 (b)(1) Any member who has first established at least five years of membership service 23 credit as a teacher in the public schools of Georgia or the University System of Georgia; 24 provided, further, that such service credit shall be allowed shall be eligible to obtain 25 creditable service in this retirement system on the basis of one year of credit for such each 26 year of external teaching service for each per additional year of membership service as 27 a teacher in the public schools of Georgia or the University System of Georgia; provided, however, that the total creditable service allowed under this paragraph shall not exceed 28 29 ten years.

30 (2) For any member who has at least three years of membership credit as a teacher in the 31 public schools of Georgia or the University System of Georgia and rendered external 32 teaching service while being married to an active duty member of the armed forces of the 33 United States, such member shall be eligible to obtain creditable service in this retirement 34 system for each year of such external teaching service as such a spouse; provided, 35 however, that such member must retire at normal retirement age as a teacher in Georgia 36 and the total creditable service allowed under this Code section to such a member shall 37 not exceed 25 years. 38 (c) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this Code section, any eligible A teacher 39 desiring to establish credit obtain creditable service for such external teaching service must

40 <u>shall pay to the board of trustees prior to retirement an amount equal to the total employee</u>
41 and employer contributions which would have been paid to the retirement system on a

42 salary comparable to his <u>or her</u> salary for such <u>external teaching</u> service, plus the applicable

rate of interest, in accordance with regulations adopted by the board of trustees. Such
 contributions must be paid prior to retirement under this retirement system.

(d)(1) For such service rendered prior to January 1, 1945, the rate of employee
contributions shall be 5 percent and the rate of employer contributions shall be 6.83
percent. The rate of interest on such contributions shall be the applicable regular interest.
No member who receives or who is entitled to receive a pension or annuity from any
other state, county, or municipality, or federal retirement program excluding social
security, shall receive creditable service for such service. The board of trustees shall
promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this Code section.

52 (b)(2) Any provisions of this Code section to the contrary notwithstanding, teachers who 53 became members of the retirement system prior to April 1, 1966, shall be permitted to establish credit for a maximum of ten years of service in school systems of other states 54 55 in the United States that permit retirement credit for teaching service rendered in Georgia 56 public schools, by paying 8 percent of such out-of-state compensation that they received, 57 plus applicable accumulated interest, in accordance with regulations adopted by the board 58 of trustees. Such members may establish credit for one year of out-of-state service for 59 each year of membership service in the public schools of Georgia or the University 60 System of Georgia rendered after the first five years of membership service.

(e) No member shall be eligible for creditable service under paragraph (2) of
 subsection (b) of this Code section for any external teaching service that has been or will
 be used in the determination of eligibility for retirement benefits or allowances from any
 other state or federal retirement program, excluding social security."

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SECTION 2.

This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2024, only if it is determined to have been
concurrently funded as provided in Chapter 20 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia
Annotated, the "Public Retirement Systems Standards Law"; otherwise, this Act shall not

- 69 become effective and shall be automatically repealed in its entirety on July 1, 2024, as
- 70 required by subsection (a) of Code Section 47-20-50.

71 **SECTION 3.**

72 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
