A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Artic	cle 3 of (Chapter 1	1 of Titl	e 16 of th	e Official	Code of	Georgia .	Annotated,
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- 2 relating to invasions of privacy, so as to provide for a definition; to provide for the lawful use
- 3 of unmanned aircraft; to prohibit the capturing of certain images by unmanned aircraft; to
- 4 prohibit the possession, disclosure, display, distribution, or other use of such improperly
- 5 captured images; to provide for penalties; to provide for defenses to prosecution; to restrict
- 6 the use of such images; to provide for civil actions for violations; to provide for rulemaking
- 7 authority for the Department of Public Safety for law enforcement use of such unmanned
- 8 aircraft; to provide for certain reports; to provide for related matters; to provide for an
- 9 effective date and applicability; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 12 Article 3 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 13 invasions of privacy, is amended by adding a new part to read as follows:
- 14 "Part 3
- 15 <u>16-11-90.</u>

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- As used in this part, the term 'image' means any capturing of sound waves; thermal,
- infrared, ultraviolet, visible light, or other electromagnetic waves; odor; or other conditions
- 18 existing on or about real property in this state or an individual located on such property.
- 19 <u>16-11-91.</u>
- 20 (a) It shall be lawful to capture an image using an unmanned aircraft in this state:
- 21 (1) For purposes of professional or scholarly research and development by a person
- 22 <u>acting on behalf of an institution of higher education in this state, including a person who:</u>
- 23 (A) Is a professor, employee, or student of the institution; or

24 (B) Is under contract with or otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of the

- 25 <u>institution;</u>
- 26 (2) In airspace designated as a test site or range authorized by the Federal Aviation
- 27 Administration for the purpose of integrating unmanned aircraft systems into the national
- 28 <u>airspace</u>;
- 29 (3) As part of an operation, exercise, or mission of any branch of the United States
- 30 <u>military;</u>
- 31 (4) If the image is captured by a satellite for the purpose of mapping;
- 32 (5) If the image is captured by or for an electric or natural gas utility:
- 33 (A) For operations and maintenance of utility facilities for the purpose of maintaining
- 34 <u>utility system reliability and integrity;</u>
- 35 (B) For inspecting utility facilities to determine repair, maintenance, or replacement
- 36 <u>needs during and after construction of such facilities;</u>
- 37 (C) For assessing vegetation growth for the purpose of maintaining clearances on
- 38 <u>utility easements; and</u>
- 39 (D) For utility facility routing and siting for the purpose of providing utility service;
- 40 (6) With the consent of the individual who owns or lawfully occupies the real property
- 41 <u>captured in the image;</u>
- 42 (7) Pursuant to a valid search or arrest warrant;
- 43 (8) If the image is captured by a law enforcement authority or a person who is under
- 44 <u>contract with or otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of a law enforcement</u>
- 45 <u>authority:</u>
- 46 (A) In immediate pursuit of a person law enforcement officers have reasonable
- 47 <u>suspicion to believe or probable cause to suspect has committed an offense, not</u>
- including misdemeanors or offenses punishable by a fine only;
- 49 (B) For the purpose of documenting a crime scene where an offense, not including
- 50 <u>misdemeanors or offenses punishable by a fine only, has been committed;</u>
- 51 (C) For the purpose of investigating the scene of:
- 52 <u>(i) A human fatality;</u>
- 53 (ii) A motor vehicle accident causing death or serious bodily injury to a person; or
- 54 (iii) Any motor vehicle accident on a state highway or federal interstate or highway;
- (D) In connection with the search for a missing person;
- (E) For the purpose of conducting a high-risk tactical operation that poses a threat to
- 57 <u>human life; or</u>
- 58 <u>(F) Of private property that is generally open to the public where the property owner</u>
- 59 <u>consents to law enforcement public safety responsibilities;</u>

60 (9) If the image is captured by state or local law enforcement authorities, or a person who

- 61 <u>is under contract with or otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of such</u>
- authorities, for the purpose of:
- 63 (A) Surveying the scene of a catastrophe or other damage to determine whether a state
- of emergency should be declared;
- (B) Preserving public safety, protecting property, or surveying damage or
- 66 contamination during a lawfully declared state of emergency; or
- 67 (C) Conducting routine air quality sampling and monitoring, as provided by state or
- 68 <u>local law;</u>
- 69 (10) At the scene of a spill, or a suspected spill, of hazardous materials;
- 70 (11) For the purpose of fire suppression;
- 71 (12) For the purpose of rescuing a person whose life or well-being is in imminent danger;
- 72 (13) If the image is captured by a real estate broker who is licensed in this state in
- connection with the marketing, sale, or financing of real property, provided that no
- 74 <u>individual is identifiable in the image;</u>
- 75 (14) From a height no more than eight feet above ground level in a public place, if the
- 76 <u>image was captured without using any electronic, mechanical, or other means to amplify</u>
- 77 <u>the image beyond normal human perception;</u>
- 78 (15) Of public real property or a person on such property;
- 79 (16) If the image is captured by the owner or operator of an oil, gas, water, or other
- pipeline for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining, or repairing pipelines or other related
- 81 <u>facilities and is captured without the intent to conduct surveillance on an individual or</u>
- 82 <u>real property located in this state;</u>
- 83 (17) In connection with oil pipeline safety and protection; or
- 84 (18) In connection with port authority surveillance and security.
- 85 (b) This part does not apply to the manufacture, assembly, distribution, or sale of an
- 86 <u>unmanned aircraft.</u>
- 87 <u>16-11-92.</u>
- 88 (a) It shall be illegal for a person to use an unmanned aircraft to capture an image of an
- 89 <u>individual or privately owned real property in this state with the intent to conduct</u>
- 90 <u>surveillance on such individual or property.</u>
- 91 (b) Any person who violates this Code section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 92 (c) It is a defense to prosecution under this Code section that the person destroyed the
- 93 <u>image:</u>
- 94 (1) As soon as the person had knowledge that the image was captured in violation of this
- 95 <u>Code section; and</u>

96 (2) Without disclosing, displaying, or distributing the image to a third party.

- 97 <u>16-11-93.</u>
- 98 (a) It shall be illegal for a person to:
- 99 (1) Capture an image in violation of Code Section 16-11-92; and
- 100 (2) Possess, disclose, display, distribute, or otherwise use such image.
- (b) Any person who violates subsection (a) of this Code section by possessing an image
- shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Any person who violates subsection (a) of this Code
- section by disclosing, displaying, distributing, or otherwise using an image shall be guilty
- of a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature.
- (c) Each image a person possesses, discloses, displays, distributes, or otherwise uses in
- violation of this Code section shall constitute a separate offense.
- 107 (d) It shall be a defense to prosecution under this Code section for the possession of an
- image that the person destroyed the image as soon as the person had knowledge that the
- image was captured in violation of Code Section 16-11-92.
- (e) It shall be a defense to prosecution under this Code section for the disclosure, display,
- distribution, or other use of an image that the person stopped disclosing, displaying,
- distributing, or otherwise using the image as soon as the person had knowledge that the
- image was captured in violation of Code Section 16-11-92.
- 114 <u>16-11-94.</u>
- (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this Code section, an image captured
- in violation of Code Section 16-11-92 or an image captured by an unmanned aircraft that
- was incidental to the lawful capturing of an image:
- (1) Shall not be used as evidence in any criminal or juvenile proceeding, civil action, or
- administrative proceeding;
- (2) Shall not be subject to disclosure, inspection, or copying under Article 4 of
- 121 <u>Chapter 18 of Title 50; and</u>
- 122 (3) Shall not be subject to discovery, subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion for
- its release.
- (b) An image described in subsection (a) of this Code section may be disclosed and used
- as evidence to prove a violation of this part and is subject to discovery, subpoena, or other
- means of legal compulsion for such purpose.
- 127 <u>16-11-95.</u>
- (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'malice' means a specific intent by the defendant
- to cause substantial injury or harm to the claimant.

(b) An owner or tenant of privately owned real property located in this state may bring

- against a person who, in violation of Code Section 16-11-92, captured an image of the
- property or the owner or tenant while on the property an action to:
- (1) Enjoin a violation or imminent violation of Code Section 16-11-92 or 16-11-93;
- (2) Recover a civil penalty of:
- (A) Five thousand dollars for all images captured in a single episode in violation of
- 136 <u>Code Section 16-11-92; or</u>
- (B) Ten thousand dollars for disclosure, display, distribution, or other use of any
- images captured in a single episode in violation of Code Section 16-11-93; or
- (3) Recover actual damages if the person who captured the image in violation of Code
- Section 16-11-93 discloses, displays, or distributes the image with malice.
- (c) For purposes of recovering the civil penalty or actual damages under subsection (a) of
- this Code section, all owners of a parcel of real property are considered to be a single
- owner and all tenants of a parcel of real property are considered to be a single tenant.
- (d) In addition to any civil penalties authorized under this Code section, the court shall
- award court costs and reasonable attorney's fees to the prevailing party.
- (e) An action brought under this Code section shall be commenced within two years from
- the date the image was:
- (1) Captured in violation of Code Section 16-11-92; or
- (2) Initially disclosed, displayed, distributed, or otherwise used in violation of Code

- 152 The Department of Public Safety shall adopt rules and guidelines for use of an unmanned
- aircraft by law enforcement authorities in this state.
- 154 <u>16-11-97.</u>
- 155 (a) Not earlier than January 1 and not later than January 15 of each odd-numbered year,
- each state law enforcement agency and each county or municipal law enforcement agency
- 157 <u>located in a county or municipality that used or operated an unmanned aircraft during the</u>
- preceding 24 months shall issue a written report to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor,
- and each member of the General Assembly and shall:
- 160 (1) Retain the report for public viewing; and
- (2) Post the report on the law enforcement agency's publicly accessible website, if one
- exists.
- (b) The report shall include:

164 (1) The number of times an unmanned aircraft was used, organized by date, time, location, and the types of incidents and justification for the use; 165 (2) The number of criminal investigations aided by the use of an unmanned aircraft and 166 a description of how the unmanned aircraft aided each investigation; 167 (3) The number of times an unmanned aircraft aided a law enforcement operation other 168 169 than a criminal investigation, the dates and locations of such operations, and a description of how the unmanned aircraft aided each operation; 170 (4) The type of information collected on an individual, residence, property, or area that 171 172 was not the subject of a law enforcement operation and the frequency of the collection 173 of such information; and (5) The total cost of acquiring, maintaining, repairing, and operating or otherwise using 174 each unmanned aircraft for the preceding 24 months." 175 176 **SECTION 2.** This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2014, and shall apply to the use of unmanned 177 aircraft on and after such date. 178 179 **SECTION 3.** 180 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
