

House Bill 849

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 19-7-5 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 reporting of child abuse, so as to add human resources personnel and supervisory personnel
3 in a workplace that employs minors as mandatory reporters for child abuse; to require the
4 provision of training for such human resources personnel and supervisory personnel; to
5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Code Section 19-7-5 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to reporting of child
9 abuse, is amended by adding new paragraphs to subsection (b), by revising paragraph (1) of
10 subsection (c), and by adding a new subsection to read as follows:

11 "(6.2) 'Human resources personnel' means persons employed to perform functions
12 relating to the hiring and administration of employees by a business which has five or
13 more employees and which employs minors."

14 "(12) 'Supervisory personnel' means an adult employed by a business which has five or
15 more employees whose duties require direct contact with and supervision in the
16 workplace of one or more minors employed by such business."

17 "(c)(1) The following persons having reasonable cause to believe that suspected child
18 abuse has occurred shall report or cause reports of such abuse to be made as provided in
19 this Code section:

20 (A) Physicians licensed to practice medicine, physician assistants, interns, or residents;

21 (B) Hospital or medical personnel;

22 (C) Dentists;

23 (D) Licensed psychologists and persons participating in internships to obtain licensing
24 pursuant to Chapter 39 of Title 43;

25 (E) Podiatrists;

26 (F) Registered professional nurses or licensed practical nurses licensed pursuant to
27 Chapter 26 of Title 43 or nurse's aides;

28 (G) Professional counselors, social workers, or marriage and family therapists licensed
29 pursuant to Chapter 10A of Title 43;

30 (H) School teachers;

31 (I) School administrators;

32 (J) School counselors, visiting teachers, school social workers, or school psychologists
33 certified pursuant to Chapter 2 of Title 20;

34 (K) Child welfare agency personnel, as such agency is defined in Code Section
35 49-5-12;

36 (L) Child-counseling personnel;

37 (M) Child service organization personnel;

38 (N) Law enforcement personnel; ~~or~~

39 (O) Reproductive health care facility or pregnancy resource center personnel and
40 volunteers;

41 (P) Human resources personnel; or

42 (Q) Supervisory personnel."

43 "(j) Any business that employs human resources personnel or supervisory personnel shall
44 provide training to any such human resources personnel or supervisory personnel regarding
45 the requirements of this Code section."

46 **SECTION 2.**

47 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
