## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 14 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 cemetery and funeral services, so as to provide additional time under certain circumstances
- 3 for purchasers of burial lots, burial rights, burial merchandise, and burial services to pursue
- 4 a civil cause of action against sellers that violate certain laws; to specify the civil remedies
- 5 available for such violations; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date;
- 6 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 14 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to cemetery and
- 10 funeral services, is amended by revising Code Section 10-14-21, relating to purchaser's
- 11 remedy for violations, as follows:

- 13 (a) Any person who violates any provision of subsection (a) of Code Section 10-14-17
- shall be liable to the person buying such burial lot, burial right, burial merchandise, or
- burial service services; and such buyer may bring action in any court of competent
- jurisdiction to recover the consideration paid in cash for the burial lot, burial right, burial

merchandise, or burial <u>service</u> <u>services</u> together with interest at the legal rate from the date of such payment, and reasonable attorney's fees and costs.

- 19 (b) In addition to the remedy set forth in subsection (a) of this Code section, a purchaser
- 20 may apply to a court of competent jurisdiction in this state for an order authorizing the
- 21 recovery of the preneed escrow deposit if a registrant fails to deliver burial merchandise
- or perform preneed burial services in accordance with the terms of the preneed sales
- 23 contract.
- 24 (c) A cause of No person may bring action under this Code section more than shall be
- 25 <u>brought within</u> two years from the date of the scheduled completion of the contract for sale
- or, within two years from the date of the sale if there is no contract for sale, or within two
- years after the person bringing the action knew or through the exercise of reasonable
- 28 <u>diligence should have discovered the alleged violation of Code Section 10-14-17,</u>
- 29 whichever is later; provided, however, that in no event shall the recovery of interest
- 30 provided for in subsection (a) of this Code section exceed two years.
- 31 (d) Every cause of action under this chapter survives the death of any person who might
- have been a plaintiff or defendant.
- 33 (e) Nothing in this chapter shall limit any statutory or common-law right of any person in
- any court for any act involving the sale of a burial lot, burial right, burial merchandise, or
- 35 burial services."

36 SECTION 2.

- 37 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 38 without such approval.

SECTION 3.

40 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
