## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to education, so as to
- 2 require the University System of Georgia and the Technical College System of Georgia to
- 3 make menstrual hygiene products available at no cost to students in certain facilities or
- 4 portions of facilities of institutions; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws;
- 5 and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to education, is amended in
- 9 Part 2 of Article 2 of Chapter 3, relating to the University System of Georgia, by adding a
- 10 new Code section to read as follows:

- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'menstrual hygiene products' means tampons and
- sanitary napkins for use in connection with the menstrual cycle.

- of facilities of institutions of the University System of Georgia that are:
