A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 4 of Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 holidays and observances, so as to revise the public and legal holidays recognized and
- 3 observed by the State of Georgia; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective
- 4 date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Chapter 4 of Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to holidays and
- 8 observances, is amended by revising subsections (a) and (b) of Code Section 1-4-1, relating
- 9 to public and legal holidays and leave for observance of religious holidays not specifically
- 10 provided for, as follows:

- 11 "(a) The State of Georgia shall recognize and observe as public and legal holidays:
- 12 (1) All days which have been designated as of January 1, 1984, 2022, as public and legal
- holidays by the federal government; and
- 14 (2) All other days designated and proclaimed by the Governor as public and legal
- holidays or as days of fasting and prayer or other religious observance. In such
- designation, the Governor shall include at least one of the following dates: January 19,

17 April 26, or June 3, or a suitable date in lieu thereof to commemorate the event or events 18 now observed by such dates.

- 19 (b) The Governor shall close all state offices and facilities a minimum of 12 13 days
- 20 throughout the year and not more than $\frac{12}{12}$ days in observance of the public and legal
- 21 holidays and other days set forth in subsection (a) of this Code section and shall specify the
- days state offices and facilities shall be closed for such observances."

23 SECTION 2.

- 24 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming
- 25 law without such approval.

SECTION 3.

27 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
