A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to game and fish, so
2 as to revise definitions, license fees, and license requirements; to amend Code Section 52-7-5
3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to numbering of vessels, requirements,
4 and fees, so as to revise boat registration fees and allow additional methods for reporting the
5 sale of boats; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date and applicability;
6 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to game and fish, is amended in
10 Code Section 27-1-2, relating to definitions relative to game and fish, by adding a new
11 paragraph to read as follows:

12 "(63.1) 'Seafood dealer' means any person other than the consumer who purchases, ships,
13 consigns, transfers, barter, accepts, maintains, or packs any marine fishery products
14 received from commercial seafood harvesters or marine aquaculturists for the first time."

15 **SECTION 2.**

16 Said title is further amended in Code Section 27-1-6, relating to powers and duties of the
17 Department of Natural Resources, by revising paragraph (10) as follows:

18 "(10) To develop an official waterfowl stamp for the State of Georgia and to issue such
19 stamp to any interested person and to contract with any person granting such person the
20 right to reproduce and market the official waterfowl stamp in stamp, print, poster, or such
21 other form as the department shall determine and to contract with any person for the
22 purpose of promoting, supporting, or otherwise assisting any waterfowl program of the
23 department, including, but not limited to, public education; research; acquisition of
24 wetlands; and management, development, and protection of waterfowl programs;
25 provided, however, that not more than 15 percent of the funds retained by the department,

26 if any, shall be used for law enforcement activities. The department is authorized to
 27 establish a special fund to be known as the 'Waterfowl Stamp Fund.' This fund shall
 28 consist of all moneys paid to the department as royalties, 50 percent of all revenue
 29 received from the sale of Georgia migratory bird licenses, all moneys derived from the
 30 sale of any official waterfowl stamp, and all moneys contributed to the fund for the
 31 purposes provided in this paragraph and all interest thereon. All balances in the fund
 32 shall be deposited in an interest-bearing account identifying the fund and shall be carried
 33 forward each year so that no part thereof may be deposited in the general treasury. The
 34 department shall administer the fund and may expend moneys held in the fund in
 35 furtherance of the purposes provided in this paragraph. Moneys paid into this fund shall
 36 be deemed supplemental to and shall in no way supplant funding that would otherwise
 37 be appropriate for these purposes. As used in this paragraph, the term 'waterfowl' means
 38 any species of ducks, swans, or geese."

39 **SECTION 3.**

40 Said title is further amended in Code Section 27-2-1, relating to hunting, trapping, or fishing
 41 without a license or permit, by revising subsection (b) as follows:

42 "(b) It shall be unlawful for any resident of this state who has attained the age of 16 years
 43 to hunt, fish in the waters of this state, or trap without a valid hunting license, fishing
 44 license, or trapping license, respectively, as provided in Code Section 27-2-23, except on
 45 premises owned by him or her or his or her immediate family; provided, however, that the
 46 resident owner of any vessel with a valid registration in accordance with Code Section
 47 52-7-5 shall have, as part of the registration fee for such vessel, a paid ~~three-day~~ one-day
 48 resident hunting and fishing license ~~that begins~~ valid only on such owner's date of birth ~~and~~
 49 ~~extends two consecutive days thereafter~~ in accordance with the requirements of this title
 50 and as otherwise specified by the department. It shall be unlawful for any resident of this
 51 state to hunt, fish, or trap in this state without carrying such license upon his or her person,
 52 except on premises owned by him or her or his or her immediate family and except when
 53 otherwise specifically directed by authorized personnel of the department."

54 **SECTION 4.**

55 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 27-2-3, relating to effective periods
 56 of hunting, fishing, and trapping licenses, as follows:

57 "27-2-3.

58 (a) Except as otherwise specifically provided, all hunting, fishing, and trapping licenses,
 59 including without limitation commercial fishing and commercial fishing boat licenses
 60 issued pursuant to Code Section 27-2-8, shall be effective from April 1 to March 31 of the

61 following year; except that all annual, two-year, or other multiyear hunting, fishing, and
 62 hunting and fishing combination licenses issued pursuant to paragraphs (1) through (4) of
 63 Code Section 27-2-23 shall be effective through the applicable one-year, two-year, or
 64 multiyear anniversary of the date of issuance. If a person possesses a valid annual,
 65 two-year, or other multiyear hunting, fishing, or hunting and fishing combination license
 66 at the time of sale of one or more annual, two-year, or other multiyear licenses with
 67 identical privileges to the valid license, the new license or licenses shall become effective
 68 when the original license expires and shall remain valid through the full applicable period.
 69 The department may specify the effective dates and term of the following licenses or
 70 permits:

71 (1) The migratory bird license to meet requirements of Code Section 27-2-20;

72 (2) The free Georgia salt water fishing endorsement to meet requirements of Code
 73 Section 27-2-20.1; and

74 (3) Any permit or requirement authorized by Code Section 27-3-29 regarding harvest
 75 recording and reporting.

76 (b) Multiyear licenses valid for any desired number of years may be purchased through a
 77 single transaction for licenses listed in paragraphs (1) through (4) of Code Section 27-2-23.
 78 The fee for any such multiyear license shall be equivalent to the lowest cost combination
 79 of annual or two-year licenses necessary to form the desired multiyear license period. No
 80 ~~multiyear resident~~ license shall be valid at the time of hunting or fishing unless the licensee
 81 is a resident of this state at such time, except for lifetime licenses."

82 SECTION 5.

83 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 27-2-3.1, relating to hunting and
 84 sportsman's licenses, as follows:

85 "27-2-3.1.

86 (a) The requirements in this title for procuring any paid license or permit for
 87 noncommercial hunting and fishing privileges, except for ~~hunting~~ harvesting alligators,
 88 shall be satisfied by a resident or nonresident who procures a sportsman's license. ~~An~~
 89 ~~applicant for such license shall, prior to the issuance of the license, complete a screening~~
 90 ~~questionnaire associated with the federal Migratory Bird Harvest Information Program.~~
 91 ; provided, however, that the department may specify other nonpaid licenses and permits
 92 required by law or by rule or regulation of the board. An applicant for such license shall
 93 furnish all information required by the department prior to the issuance of such license. An
 94 applicant for any paid or nonpaid license who is a resident shall certify and provide
 95 satisfactory evidence of his or her residency as set forth in paragraph (4) of subsection (c)
 96 of this Code section.

97 (b) All licenses, stamps, or permits for noncommercial hunting and fishing privileges shall
 98 be attached to or printed on a form provided by the department which shall include the
 99 applicant's name, address, date of birth, and hunter safety certification number; provided,
 100 however, that each such item of information may be, but is not required to be, printed on
 101 lifetime licenses.

102 (c)(1) The requirements in this title for procuring any paid license, stamp, or permit for
 103 noncommercial hunting and fishing privileges shall be satisfied by a resident or
 104 nonresident who procures a lifetime sportsman's license; provided, however, that the
 105 department may specify other required nonpaid licenses and permits required by law or
 106 by rule or regulation of the board for such resident or nonresident and that an applicant
 107 for such license shall furnish all information required by the department prior to the
 108 issuance of such license; and provided, further, that the requirements in this title for
 109 procuring any paid license, stamp, or permit for noncommercial hunting or for
 110 noncommercial fishing privileges, separately, shall be satisfied by a resident or
 111 nonresident who procures a lifetime sportsman's license for hunting only or for fishing
 112 only, respectively, as described in subparagraph (d)(1)(E) of this Code section.

113 ~~(2) An applicant for such license who is a resident shall certify and provide satisfactory~~
 114 ~~evidence of his or her residency as set forth in paragraph (5) of this subsection.~~

115 ~~(3)~~ An applicant for a veteran's lifetime sportsman's license shall, in addition to
 116 satisfactory evidence of residency, be required to provide satisfactory evidence that he
 117 or she served more than 90 days of federal active duty military service and was honorably
 118 discharged.

119 ~~(4)~~(3) An applicant for ~~such a lifetime~~ sportsman's license who is a nonresident shall not
 120 be eligible for issuance of such license unless:

121 (A) He or she is from two through 15 years of age and is the grandchild of a resident
 122 who holds a valid paid lifetime sportsman's license (~~not excluding a no-cost~~ Type S
 123 lifetime license). The resident grandparent who holds such a lifetime sportsman's
 124 license and who is the sponsor of an eligible nonresident applicant for a lifetime
 125 sportsman's license shall certify the nonresident applicant's relationship to him or her
 126 in writing to the department; or

127 (B) He or she is less than two years of age.

128 ~~(5)~~(4)(A) For purposes of procuring a lifetime sportsman's license, the term 'residency'
 129 means a domicile within Georgia for a minimum of three consecutive months
 130 immediately prior to procuring such license. Satisfactory evidence of residency shall
 131 consist of a current Georgia driver's license or official Georgia identification card
 132 issued by the Department of Driver Services; provided, however, that no license or

133 identification card issued pursuant to Code Section 40-5-21.1 shall satisfy the
134 requirements of this paragraph.

135 (B) Minors under 18 years of age shall be presumed to be residents upon proof of
136 parent's resident status as provided for in this Code section. For purposes of procuring
137 the Type I (Infant) and Type Y (Youth) lifetime license, a copy of a certified copy of
138 the birth certificate of the licensee shall be required to show age (Types I and Y) and
139 parentage (Type Y). A court order or other legal document establishing parental rights
140 or legal custody may be provided to show parentage.

141 (d)(1) Lifetime sportsman's licenses and fees for residents shall be as follows:

142 (A) Type I (Infant), available only to those individuals under two years of age: ~~\$200.00~~
143 \$500.00;

144 (B) Type Y (Youth), available only to those individuals from two through 15 years of
145 age: ~~\$350.00~~ \$600.00;

146 (C) Type A (Adult), available to those individuals 16 years to 49 years of age ~~or older~~:
147 ~~\$500.00~~ \$750.00;

148 (C.1) Type OA (Older Adult), available to those individuals 50 years to 59 years of
149 age: \$375.00;

150 (D) Type SD (Senior Discount), available to those individuals 60 years to 64 years of
151 age ~~or older~~: ~~\$95.00~~ \$315.00;

152 (E) Type S (Senior), available to those individuals 65 years of age or older born on or
153 before June 30, 1952: no charge; The lifetime sportsman's licenses and fees available
154 to those individuals 65 years of age and older born after June 30, 1952, shall be as
155 follows:

156 (i) Type SP (Senior Paid): \$70.00;

157 (ii) Type SH (Senior Hunt), for hunting only: \$35.00; and

158 (iii) Type SF (Senior Fish), for fishing only: \$35.00;

159 (F) Type V (Veterans), available only to those individuals who served more than 90
160 days of federal active duty military service and were honorably discharged: 80 percent
161 of the amount of the fee specified for Type A lifetime sportsman's licenses in
162 subparagraph (C) of this paragraph; ~~and~~

163 (G) Type M (Military), available only to those residents currently in active military
164 service and who are in possession of a valid United States Department of Defense
165 Common Access Card with a Uniformed Services affiliation. As used in this
166 subsection, the term 'active military service' means service on active duty with the
167 armed forces of the United States or service with a reserve component of the armed
168 forces of the United States, including service in the Georgia National Guard or National

169 Guard of another state: 80 percent of the amount of the fee specified for Type A
 170 lifetime sportsman's licenses in subparagraph (C) of this paragraph; and
 171 ~~(G)~~(H) Type SP (Shooting Preserve), available to any individual, resident or
 172 nonresident, and which entitles the holder to hunt pen raised game birds and fish in any
 173 private or state waters within the boundaries of a properly licensed shooting preserve:
 174 \$75.00.

175 (2) The fee for any lifetime sportsman's license for a nonresident, Type NR, shall be
 176 twice the amount of the fee for a Type A (Adult) lifetime sportsman's license for a
 177 resident, except that the fee for a nonresident Type I (Infant) license shall be the same fee
 178 as for a resident Type I (Infant) license.

179 (e) Lifetime sportsman's licenses shall be valid for the lifetime of the purchaser, whether
 180 resident or nonresident. Change of residency to another state shall not affect the validity
 181 of the lifetime license when hunting or fishing in Georgia.

182 (f) The commissioner shall revoke the lifetime sportsman's license of any person who
 183 knowingly attempts to or does purchase, obtain, or assist another person to obtain a lifetime
 184 sportsman's license by fraudulent means, without refund of any fees paid.

185 (g) Upon payment of a replacement fee of up to ~~\$10.00~~ \$15.00, any durable plastic card
 186 showing a lifetime sportsman's license or other valid license may be replaced if lost, stolen,
 187 or destroyed, provided that the applicant's name and lifetime license number or other
 188 required license information are in the records of the department.

189 (h) Once a lifetime license is issued, no refunds of fees will be made except in the case of
 190 the death before age 16 years of a Type I (Infant) lifetime license holder or a Type Y
 191 (Youth) license holder, in which case a full refund of fees collected may be made upon
 192 submission of the lifetime license and any other documentation required by the department.

193 (i) The requirements in this title for procuring any paid license, stamp, or permit for
 194 noncommercial hunting and fishing privileges shall be satisfied by a resident youth
 195 younger than 16 years of age who procures an optional annual or an optional multiyear
 196 resident youth sportsman's license. The requirements in this title for procuring any paid
 197 license, stamp, or permit for noncommercial fishing privileges shall be satisfied by a youth
 198 younger than 16 years of age who procures an optional annual or an optional multiyear
 199 resident youth license for fishing only. A resident youth multiyear fishing license or
 200 resident youth multiyear sportsman's license will be valid from the time of purchase until
 201 such person reaches 17 years of age. The department may require satisfactory evidence to
 202 show age and residency before issuing an annual or youth multiyear license."

203 **SECTION 6.**

204 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 27-2-4, relating to honorary licenses,
 205 as follows:

206 "27-2-4.

207 (a) The department shall issue ~~an honorary~~ a discounted hunting and fishing license, which
 208 shall entitle a resident to hunt and fish in this state without the payment of fees described
 209 in Code Section 27-2-23, to each resident who is permanently and totally disabled. For
 210 purposes of this Code section, a permanent, total disability shall be a physical or mental
 211 impairment of a total and permanent nature ~~which prevents gainful employment and which~~
 212 is certified as such by the United States Department of Veteran Affairs, the Social Security
 213 Administration, Medicaid, medicare, the Railroad Retirement System, or a unit of federal,
 214 state, or local government recognized by the board by rule or regulation; provided,
 215 however, that persons disabled because of a mental impairment shall be issued ~~an honorary~~
 216 a discounted fishing license only. Persons issued ~~an honorary~~ a discounted license under
 217 disability provisions shall renew such licenses and recertify their eligibility for such
 218 licenses every three years; provided, however, that ~~honorary~~ licenses issued pursuant to this
 219 subsection and in effect as of July 1, 1998, shall not require renewal. The triennial fee for
 220 a discounted license issued pursuant to this subsection shall be \$9.00 (\$3.00 annually) for
 221 hunting or fishing only and \$15.00 (\$5.00 annually) for hunting and fishing combined.

222 (b) Any resident who is totally blind and who applies to the department shall receive a
 223 lifetime honorary fishing license which shall entitle the holder thereof to fish in this state
 224 without the payment of any fee whatsoever.

225 (c) Any person holding a valid honorary or discounted license pursuant to this Code
 226 section shall not be required to obtain the trout license and big game license otherwise
 227 required by Code Section 27-2-6.

228 (d) All honorary and discounted hunting and fishing licenses are subject to all wildlife
 229 laws, rules, and regulations with the exception of the provisions requiring the payment of
 230 fees described in Code Section 27-2-23 for such licenses. Such honorary and discounted
 231 licenses may be revoked in accordance with this title. It shall be unlawful for any person
 232 who has an honorary or discounted hunting and fishing license to permit the use of same
 233 by any other person. It shall also be unlawful for any person who is not entitled to ~~an~~
 234 honorary a discounted hunting and fishing license to use such a license or for any totally
 235 and permanently disabled person issued such a license to possess or use such license when
 236 the disability is no longer total or permanent. Licenses for the totally and permanently
 237 disabled may, upon a determination that the disability is no longer total or permanent, be
 238 revoked until such time as the disability is again total and permanent.

239 (e) The commissioner is authorized to make and enter into agreements from time to time
 240 with the proper authorities of various states of the United States regarding nonresident
 241 hunting and fishing license fees for persons 65 years of age or older so as to provide
 242 ~~honorary~~ discounted hunting and fishing licenses to be issued ~~without charge~~ to
 243 nonresidents 65 years of age or older where such practice is reciprocated for Georgia
 244 residents in that person's state of residence.

245 (f) Persons holding lifetime honorary licenses issued to persons 65 years of age or older
 246 prior to April 1, 1999, shall not be required to obtain a lifetime license pursuant to Code
 247 Section 27-2-3.1, and such lifetime honorary license shall carry the same rights and
 248 privileges as a lifetime license issued pursuant to that Code section.

249 (g)(1) As used in this subsection, the term 'returning veteran' means a person who is
 250 discharged from active duty as a member of the regular or reserve component of the
 251 United States armed forces, the United States Coast Guard, the Georgia National Guard,
 252 or the Georgia Air National Guard and who was on ordered federal duty for a period of
 253 90 days or longer.

254 (2) The department shall issue an honorary hunting and fishing license to any returning
 255 veteran which shall entitle him or her to hunt and fish in this state without the payment
 256 of fees described in Code Section 27-2-23 for a period of one year following issuance.
 257 A returning veteran requesting such an honorary license shall provide proof of his or her
 258 discharge."

259 **SECTION 7.**

260 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 27-2-4.2, relating to courtesy
 261 nonresident fishing licenses for certain veterans, as follows:

262 "27-2-4.2.

263 The department is authorized to issue a courtesy nonresident fishing license, without fee,
 264 to any person who is not a resident of this state who is a paralyzed or disabled veteran and
 265 who is participating in an organized fishing tournament in this state which is sponsored and
 266 conducted by a nonprofit charitable association of paralyzed or disabled veterans, provided
 267 that such tournament is approved by the department. Such courtesy nonresident license
 268 shall be valid for use only during the specified dates of such tournament and for a
 269 maximum of seven days and shall include all requirements and privileges of a nonresident
 270 fishing license, including the nonresident trout license, for use only in association with such
 271 tournament."

272

SECTION 8.

273 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 27-2-5, relating to required hunter
274 education courses, as follows:

275 "27-2-5.

276 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person born on or after January 1, 1961, to procure a
277 hunting license or to hunt by means of weapons in this state unless that person has been
278 issued a certificate or other evidence the department deems acceptable which indicates
279 satisfactory completion of a hunter education course as prescribed by the board. Persons
280 ages ~~16~~ 12 through 25 shall provide such certificate or other evidence to the issuing agent
281 at the time of purchase of a hunting license. All persons required by this subsection to
282 complete a hunter education course, by ~~signing~~ buying such license, by receiving a
283 temporary license identification number, or by receiving a license from a telephone license
284 agent, Internet license agent, or other vendor, shall certify by such action their compliance
285 with this subsection.

286 (b) It shall be unlawful for any person authorized to issue hunting licenses in this state to
287 issue a hunting license to any person age 16 through 25 unless that license agent shall have
288 been provided with a certificate showing the license applicant has satisfactorily completed
289 a hunter education course as prescribed by the board, or to any other person born on or
290 after January 1, 1961, unless such person provides such other evidence of completion of
291 a hunter education course as the department deems acceptable. Internet and telephone
292 license agents may accept a valid hunter education certificate number as fulfillment of this
293 requirement.

294 (c) It shall be unlawful for any person age 16 through 25 who is not required by law to
295 obtain a hunting license to hunt in this state unless that person carries on his or her person
296 while hunting a certificate attesting to that person's satisfactory completion of a hunter
297 education course as prescribed by the board. Such person shall present his or her certificate
298 to a conservation ranger or deputy conservation ranger for inspection upon demand.

299 (d) Any person who is age 12 through 15 shall satisfactorily complete a hunter education
300 course as a prerequisite to hunting with a weapon in this state. It shall be unlawful for any
301 adult to permit his or her child or ward age 12 through 15 to hunt with a weapon unless the
302 child has a certificate attesting to his or her satisfactory completion of such course on his
303 or her person; provided, however, that a hunter education course is not required for a child
304 ~~age 12 through 15~~ less than 16 years of age who is hunting under adult supervision by a
305 licensed adult hunter.

306 (e) Any person applying for an annual or multiyear nonresident hunting/fishing license
307 may provide a certificate of completion or such other evidence of completion the
308 department deems acceptable of the official hunter education or hunter safety course of

309 such person's state of residence if that course shall have been approved by the department.
 310 ~~Those persons~~ No one applying for a hunting license ~~other than a season hunting~~ of less
 311 than one year in duration or for a lifetime license shall ~~not~~ be required to exhibit such a
 312 certificate or to complete a hunter education course in order to obtain the license. Persons
 313 holding a lifetime license shall complete an official hunter education or hunter safety
 314 course and display proof of completion as specified by the department in order to hunt
 315 unless otherwise exempted by this title.

316 (f) By rule or regulation, the board shall prescribe a course of instruction in competency
 317 and safety in hunting and in the handling of weapons. The board shall also prescribe
 318 procedures whereby competent residents of this state shall be certified as hunter education
 319 instructors. The board may provide, by rule or regulation, for charging reasonable fees for
 320 the issuance by the department of duplicate certificates of completion of a hunter education
 321 course and for hunter education courses in order to defray the expenses of conducting such
 322 courses. Any such fees shall be deemed as 'other income' of the department for purposes
 323 of subsection (c) of Code Section 27-1-13.

324 (g) Any person violating any provision of this Code section shall be guilty of a
 325 misdemeanor; provided, however, that this subsection shall not apply to any person under
 326 the age of 16.

327 (h) The requirements of subsections (c) and (d) of this Code section shall not apply to any
 328 person hunting on his or her own land or that of his or her parents or legal guardian or to
 329 persons permitting a child or ward aged 12 through 15 years to hunt on the parent's or
 330 guardian's own land."

331 **SECTION 9.**

332 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 27-2-6, relating to trout, waterfowl,
 333 big game, and alligator licenses, as follows:

334 "27-2-6.

335 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person who has attained the age of 16 years to fish for or
 336 possess mountain trout or to fish in any waters designated as trout waters or trout streams
 337 pursuant to Code Section 27-4-51 unless such person has in his or her possession a trout
 338 license in addition to his or her fishing license.

339 (b) It shall be unlawful for any person who has attained the age of 16 years to hunt or
 340 possess big game unless such person has in his or her possession a big game license in
 341 addition to the required hunting license; provided, however, that all nonresidents,
 342 regardless of age, must possess a nonresident hunting/fishing license along with any
 343 harvest records required by law or regulation to hunt big game in this state.

344 (c) It shall be unlawful for any person who has attained the age of 16 years to hunt ducks,
 345 geese, or swans unless such person has in his or her possession ~~an official Georgia~~
 346 ~~waterfowl~~ a Georgia migratory bird license in addition to the required hunting license;
 347 provided, however, that only a Georgia migratory bird license or a landowner migratory
 348 bird license shall be required for any resident of this state to hunt migratory birds on
 349 premises owned by him or her or his or her immediate family.

350 (d) It shall be unlawful for any person who has attained the age of 16 years to hunt
 351 alligators unless such person has in his or her possession ~~an alligator hunting license in~~
 352 ~~addition to the required~~ a valid hunting license; ~~provided, however, that this subsection~~
 353 ~~shall not apply to lifetime license holders.~~ A resident or nonresident alligator permit shall
 354 be required to harvest an alligator. Such permit shall be free to lifetime license holders if
 355 selected as part of any department quota or lottery.

356 (e) No resident of this state shall be required to obtain a trout license, ~~official Georgia~~
 357 ~~waterfowl license,~~ or big game license to hunt, fish, or trap on premises owned by him or
 358 her or his or her immediate family.

359 (f) Any visitor to a state park, whether a resident or nonresident of Georgia, shall not be
 360 required to purchase a trout license when fishing in impounded waters on lands owned or
 361 leased by the department."

362 SECTION 10.

363 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 27-2-8, relating to commercial fishing

717 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2016, and shall apply to all offenses occurring on
718 or after such date.

719 **SECTION 21.**

720 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
