## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to courts, so as to
- 2 revise the qualifications for superior and state court judges; to provide for the vacation of
- 3 such offices under certain circumstances; to provide for related matters; to provide for
- 4 effective dates; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to courts, is amended by revising
- 8 Code Section 15-6-4, relating to qualifications of superior court judges, as follows:
- 9 "15-6-4.
- 10 (a) No person individual shall be judge of the superior courts unless, at the time of his or
- her election, he <u>or she</u> has attained the age of 30 years, has been a citizen of the state for
- three years, has practiced law for seven years, and is a member in good standing with the
- 13 <u>State Bar of Georgia and</u> has been duly reinstated to the practice of law in the event of his
- or her disbarment therefrom.
- 15 (b) The office of any superior court judge shall be vacated upon the disbarment or
- suspension from the practice of law of such judge by the Supreme Court whether voluntary
- or involuntary and upon order of the Supreme Court providing for such removal from
- 18 office."
- 19 SECTION 2.
- 20 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 15-7-21, relating to qualifications,
- 21 restrictions on practice of law, and removal, discipline, and involuntary retirement of judges
- 22 of the state court, as follows:
- 23 "15-7-21.
- 24 (a)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, each judge of the state
- court shall be:

26 (A) Be a resident of the geographic area in which he or she is selected to serve, shall

- 27 <u>have</u>;
- 28 (B) Have been a resident of the state for three years next preceding the beginning of
- 29 his or her term of office, shall as of such date;
- 30 (C) As of the date on which his or her term of office begins, be at least 25 years of age,
- 31 and shall have;
- 32 (D) Have been admitted to practice law for seven years; and
- 33 (E) Be a member in good standing with the State Bar of Georgia and have been duly
- reinstated to the practice of law in the event of his or her disbarment therefrom.
- 35 (2) If, at the expiration of the qualifying period for the general nonpartisan primary or
- any special election, no candidate meeting the requirements of paragraph (1) of this
- subsection has qualified, then the county election superintendent shall reopen qualifying
- for a period of 15 days, and any person <u>individual</u> may qualify who: (A) will have been
- 39 for three years next preceding the beginning of the term of office a resident of the
- superior court judicial circuit containing the geographic area in which the judge is to
- serve; and (B) meets all requirements, other than the residency requirement specified in
- 42 <u>subparagraph (A) of paragraph (1) of this subsection, for eligibility for nomination and</u>
- election to the office of state court judge. If such person individual is elected to the office
- of state court judge, such person he or she may thereafter qualify for reelection to such
- office as long as such person he or she continues to reside within the judicial circuit
- 46 containing the geographic area in which the judge is to serve and otherwise meets the
- 47 requirements of paragraph (1) of this subsection.
- (b) A full-time judge of the state court may shall not engage in the private practice of law.
- A part-time judge of the state court may engage in the private practice of law in other
- courts but may not practice in his <u>or her</u> own court or appear in any matter as to which that
- 51 judge has exercised any jurisdiction.
- 52 (c) Judges of the state courts shall be subject to discipline, removal, and involuntary
- retirement pursuant to Article VI, Section VII, Paragraphs VI and VII of the Constitution
- of the State of Georgia.
- 55 (d) The office of any judge of the state court shall be vacated upon the disbarment or
- 56 <u>suspension from the practice of law of such judge by the Supreme Court whether voluntary</u>
- or involuntary and upon order of the Supreme Court providing for such removal from
- 58 <u>office.</u>"

60 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
