## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Subpart 1 of Part 2 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of
- 2 Georgia Annotated, relating to corporal punishment, so as to prohibit the use of corporal
- 3 punishment by school administrators, teachers, and other school personnel with any student
- 4 in any public school of this state; to repeal a provision relating to when and how corporal
- 5 punishment may be administered; to repeal a provision relating to when principal or teacher
- 6 not liable for administering corporal punishment; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 7 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Subpart 1 of Part 2 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated, relating to corporal punishment, is amended by revising Code Section 20-2-730,
- 12 relating to policies and regulations on use of corporal punishment, as follows:

- 14 All area, county, and independent boards of education shall be authorized to determine and
- adopt policies and regulations relating to the use of corporal punishment by school
- principals and teachers employed by such boards. It is the policy of this state that corporal

- punishment shall not be administered by any school administrator, teacher, or other school
   personnel to any student in any public school in this state."
- 19 SECTION 2.
- 20 Said subpart is further amended by repealing Code Section 20-2-731, relating to when and
- 21 how corporal punishment may be administered.
- SECTION 3.
- 23 Said subpart is further amended by repealing Code Section 20-2-732, relating to when
- 24 principal or teacher not liable for administering corporal punishment.
- 25 SECTION 4.
- 26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
