## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and
- 2 traffic, so as to provide authority of the commissioner of driver services to enter into certain
- 3 reciprocal agreements with foreign jurisdictions; to provide for an exemption from licensing
- 4 upon production of certain licenses issued by foreign jurisdictions; to provide for an
- 5 exemption from certain testing requirements for individuals from foreign jurisdictions having
- 6 entered into reciprocal agreements; to provide for an exemption for signatures on traffic
- 7 citations in lieu of personal court appearance; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 8 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is
- amended in Code Section 40-2-88, relating to reciprocal agreements for registration of
- 13 commercial vehicles on apportionment basis and registration under the International
- 14 Registration Plan, by revising subsection (a) as follows:
- 15 "(a) In addition to and regardless of the provisions of Article 3 of this chapter or any other
- provisions of law relating to the operation of motor vehicles over the public highways of
- this state, the commissioner is authorized to enter into reciprocal agreements or plans on
- behalf of the State of Georgia with the appropriate authorities of any of the states of the
- 19 United States, the District of Columbia, a state or province of any foreign country
- 20 <u>jurisdiction</u>, or a territory or possession of the United States or any foreign <del>country</del>

<u>jurisdiction</u> providing for the registration of commercial vehicles on an apportionment basis

- and may, in the exercise of this authority, enter and become a member of the International
- 23 Registration Plan developed by the American Association of Motor Vehicle
- Administrators. Any such reciprocal agreement or plan may provide for but shall not be
- limited to the following provisions: (1) full reciprocity in accordance with such agreement
- or plan for commercial vehicles not based in Georgia, which vehicles are operated in

interstate commerce or a combination of interstate and intrastate commerce and are of specified types or weights, in exchange for equivalent reciprocity for Georgia based commercial vehicles; (2) reciprocal exchange of audits of records of the owners of such commercial vehicles by the states participating in any such agreement or plan; and (3) any other matters which would facilitate the administration of such agreement or plan, including exchange of information for audits enforcement activities and collection and disbursement of proportional registration fees for other jurisdictions in the case of Georgia based commercial vehicles."

35 SECTION 2.

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Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-5-5, relating to authority of Governor to execute binding reciprocal agreements regarding operation of motor vehicles, publication of terms of agreements, rules and regulations, and exemption for certain foreign citizens, by revising subsection (c) as follows:

"(c) The commissioner is authorized to negotiate and enter into an agreement with a foreign <del>country</del> jurisdiction that exempts the citizens of such foreign <del>country</del> jurisdiction from the knowledge test and the on-the-road driving test required in Code Section 40-5-27 so long as the citizen holds a valid driver's license of an equivalent class issued by such foreign country jurisdiction; provided, however, that no such agreement shall be entered into unless the foreign country jurisdiction offers the same reciprocity to persons holding a valid driver's license of an equivalent class issued by the State of Georgia and the commissioner determines that the laws of such foreign country jurisdiction relating to the operation of motor vehicles are sufficiently similar to such laws of this state such that driving safety shall not be compromised; and provided, further, that no such agreement shall be entered into unless the Department of Economic Development has certified that persons or entities from such country jurisdiction have made or are likely to make a substantial economic investment in this state that has or will lead to the substantial creation of jobs in this state. The provisions of this subsection notwithstanding, the department commissioner shall not be authorized to enter into any reciprocal agreement with any foreign <del>country</del> <u>jurisdiction</u> that is designated as a state sponsor of terrorism by the United States Department of State. The exemption provided for in this subsection shall not be an exemption from any other legal requirement for the issuance of a driver's license, including the requirement that the applicant demonstrate lawful presence within the United States in accordance with Code Sections 40-5-21.1 and 40-5-21.2. This subsection shall not apply to citizens of foreign countries jurisdictions applying for a commercial driver's license or Class M driver's license."

SECTION 3.

63 Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-5-21, relating to exemptions generally, by

- 64 revising subsection (a) as follows:
- 65 "(a) Except as provided in Article 7 of this chapter, the 'Uniform Commercial Driver's
- 66 License Act,' the following persons are exempt from licenses under this chapter:
- 67 (1) Any employee of the United States government while operating a motor vehicle
- owned by or leased to the United States government and which is being operated on
- official business, unless such employee is required by the United States government or
- any agency thereof to have a state driver's license;
- 71 (2) A nonresident who has in his or her immediate possession a valid driver's license
- issued to him or her in his or her home state or <del>country</del> <u>foreign jurisdiction</u>; provided,
- however, that such person would otherwise satisfy all requirements to receive a Georgia
- driver's license; and provided, further, that in the case of a driver's license issued by the
- driver's licensing authority of a foreign country jurisdiction, a law enforcement officer
- may consult such person's passport or visa to verify the validity of such license, if
- 77 available;
- 78 (3) A nonresident on active duty in the armed forces of the United States who has a valid
- 79 license issued by his or her home state, and such nonresident's spouse or dependent son
- or daughter who has a valid license issued by such person's home state;
- 81 (4) Any person on active duty in the armed forces of the United States who has in his or
- her immediate possession a valid license issued in a foreign country jurisdiction by the
- armed forces of the United States, for a period of not more than 45 days from the date of
- his or her return to the United States;
- 85 (5) Any inmate or resident patient of a state, county, or municipally owned institution
- who drives a vehicle while on the grounds of such institution and while accompanied by
- and under the direct personal supervision of a qualified driving instructor or of some
- other person duly authorized in writing to so accompany and supervise such inmate or
- 89 resident patient;
- 90 (6) Any person driving or operating a farm tractor or farm implement temporarily
- operated on a highway for the purpose of conducting farm business;
- 92 (7) Any inmate of a state, county, or municipal prison, correctional institution, or jail
- while operating a motor vehicle owned by or leased to the state, county, or municipality
- and being operated with the written approval of the warden or superintendent and in such
- manner and for such purpose as may be specified by the warden or superintendent,
- provided that such inmate, within the 60 day period prior to the grant of written authority,
- has passed the vision, written, and driving tests required for licensing a citizen to operate

98 such motor vehicle. The department shall give such tests and issue a certificate, without 99 charge therefor, to any inmate passing such tests;

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- (8) A member of the reserve components of the armed forces of the United States while operating a motor vehicle owned by or leased to the United States government and being operated in accordance with the duties of such member as a member of the reserve components of the armed forces;
- (9) Any person seeking to obtain a driver's license while taking the driving examination 104 for such license accompanied by a driver license examiner of the department or a certified 105 106 examining agent of the department;
- (10) Any migrant farm worker who works in this state less than 90 days in any calendar 107 year and who possesses a valid driver's license issued by another state; 108
  - (11) Any resident who is 15 years of age or over while taking actual in-car training in a training vehicle other than a commercial motor vehicle under the direct personal supervision of a driving instructor when such driving instructor and training vehicle are licensed by the department in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 13 of Title 43, 'The Driver Training School and Commercial Driver Training School License Act.' As used in the previous sentence, the term 'commercial motor vehicle' shall have the meaning specified in Code Section 40-5-142. All vehicles utilized for the in-car training authorized under this paragraph shall be equipped with dual controlled brakes and shall be marked with signs in accordance with the rules of the department clearly identifying such vehicles as training cars belonging to a licensed driving school. A driving instructor shall test the eyesight of any unlicensed person who will be receiving actual in-car training prior to commencement of such training, and no unlicensed driver shall receive in-car training unless such person has at least the visual acuity and horizontal field of vision as is required for issuance of a driver's license in subsection (c) of Code Section 40-5-27;
- (12) Any person while operating a personal transportation vehicle: 124
  - (A) On any way publicly maintained for the use of personal transportation vehicles by the public and no other types of motor vehicles in accordance with a local ordinance adopted pursuant to Part 3 or 6 of Article 13 of Chapter 6 of this title; or
- (B) When crossing a street or highway used by other types of motor vehicles at a 128 location designated for such crossing pursuant to subsection (d) of Code 129 Section 40-6-331 or pursuant to a PTV plan authorized by a local authority as described 130 in Part 6 of Article 13 of Chapter 6 of this title; and
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- (13) A fully autonomous vehicle with the automated driving system engaged or the 132 operator of a fully autonomous vehicle with the automated driving system engaged." 133

134	SECTION 4.
135	Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-5-27, relating to examination of applicants,
136	by revising paragraph (3) of subsection (a) as follows:
137	"(3) Neither the on-the-road driving test nor the knowledge test shall apply to:
138	(A) An applicant 18 years of age and older with a valid and current license, or a license
139	that has been expired for less than two years, issued by another state of the United
140	States or the District of Columbia; or
141	(B) An applicant who is a citizen of a foreign country jurisdiction with which the
142	commissioner has entered into a reciprocal agreement pursuant to subsection (c) of
143	Code Section 40-5-5."
144	SECTION 5.
145	Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-13-2.1, relating to signature on citations
146	required, effect of failure to sign, exemptions for out-of-state drivers, and electronic capture
147	of signature, by revising subsection (b) as follows:
148	"(b) The provisions of subsection (a) of Code Section 17-6-11 shall not apply to a person
149	in possession of a driver's license issued by a state or foreign country jurisdiction that has
150	not entered into a reciprocal agreement regarding the operation of motor vehicles with this
151	state as provided in Chapter 5 of Title 40, which provides for the suspension of a driver's
152	license by the other state or foreign country jurisdiction of a person who fails to appear for
153	trial of a traffic offense committed in this state."
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**SECTION 6.** 

155 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
