The House Committee on Public Safety and Homeland Security offers the following substitute to HB 93:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 1 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 general provisions regarding law enforcement officers and agencies, so as to prohibit law
- 3 enforcement from retaining license plate data obtained from automated license plate
- 4 recognition systems beyond a certain period; to provide for definitions; to provide for the
- 5 exchange of data obtained from license plate recognition systems by law enforcement; to
- 6 provide for criminal penalties for misuse of captured license plate data; to provide for
- 7 policies; to provide for Georgia Crime Information Center auditing; to provide for related
- 8 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 Chapter 1 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- 12 provisions regarding law enforcement officers and agencies, is amended by adding a new
- 13 Code section to read as follows:

- 15 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 16 (1) 'Automated license plate recognition system' means one or more high-speed cameras
- 17 <u>combined with computer algorithms used to convert images of license plates into</u>
- 18 <u>computer readable data.</u>
- 19 (2) 'Captured license plate data' means the global positioning device coordinates, date
- and time, photograph, license plate number, and any other data captured by or derived
- 21 <u>from an automated license plate recognition system or any other source.</u>
- 22 (3) 'Law enforcement agency' means the Department of Public Safety, the Department
- of Transportation, and any other state, local, public transit, school, college, or university
- 24 <u>agency that is responsible for the prevention and detection of crime, local government</u>
- 25 <u>code enforcement, and the enforcement of penal, traffic, toll violation, regulatory, game,</u>
- or controlled substance laws.

(4) 'Law enforcement purpose' means the investigation of an offense or activity attributed
 to a case number assigned by a law enforcement agency.

- 29 (5) 'Person' means an individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association,
- joint venture, or any other unincorporated association or group.
- 31 (b) Law enforcement agencies may collect captured license plate data. Such data shall be
- 32 <u>stored immediately upon collection and not accessed except for a law enforcement purpose.</u>
- 33 All such data collected shall be destroyed no later than 90 days after such data were
- 34 <u>originally collected unless such data are the subject matter of a toll violation or for a law</u>
- 35 <u>enforcement purpose.</u>
- 36 (c) Law enforcement agencies may exchange captured license plate data with other law
- 37 <u>enforcement agencies for law enforcement purposes.</u>
- 38 (d)(1) Any person who knowingly requests, uses, obtains, or attempts to obtain captured
- 39 <u>license plate data of a law enforcement agency under false pretenses or for any purpose</u>
- 40 <u>other than for a law enforcement purpose shall for each such offense, upon conviction</u>
- 41 <u>thereof, be fined not more than \$5,000.00 or imprisoned for not more than two years, or</u>
- 42 <u>both.</u>
- 43 (2) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to preclude a law enforcement agency
- 44 <u>from contracting with a person to hold and maintain captured license plate data for such</u>
- law enforcement agency; provided, however, that such person shall be subject to the
- 46 policies of the law enforcement agency, paragraph (1) of this subsection, and
- 47 <u>subsection (f) of this Code section.</u>
- 48 (e) Any law enforcement agency deploying an automated license plate recognition system
- 49 <u>shall maintain policies for the use and operation of such system, including but not limited</u>
- 50 <u>to policies for the training of law enforcement officers in the use of captured license plate</u>
- data consistent with this Code section.
- 52 (f) The Georgia Crime Information Center shall, when periodically conducting audits of
- 53 <u>crime reporting practices of criminal justice agencies pursuant to paragraph (4) of</u>
- 54 <u>subsection (a) of Code Section 35-3-33, conduct performance audits on the use of captured</u>
- 55 <u>license plate data consistent with this Code section.</u>
- 56 (g) Captured license plate data collected by a law enforcement agency shall not be subject
- 57 <u>to public disclosure pursuant to Article 4 of Chapter 18 of Title 50."</u>

59 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
