A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 16-5-2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 voluntary manslaughter, so as to exclude the discovery or disclosure of an individual's sexual
- 3 orientation or gender identity as being serious provocation in the context of voluntary
- 4 manslaughter; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Code Section 16-5-2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to voluntary
- 9 manslaughter, is amended by revising subsection (a) as follows:
- 10 "(a) A person commits the offense of voluntary manslaughter when he such person causes
- the death of another human being under circumstances which would otherwise be murder
- and if he such person acts solely as the result of a sudden, violent, and irresistible passion
- resulting from serious provocation sufficient to excite such passion in a reasonable person;
- 14 however, if there should have been an interval between the provocation and the killing
- sufficient for the voice of reason and humanity to be heard, of which the jury in all cases
- shall be the judge, the killing shall be attributed to deliberate revenge and be punished as
- murder. As used in this subsection, the term 'serious provocation' shall not include the
- discovery or disclosure of an alleged victim's sexual orientation or gender identity."

19 SECTION 2.

20 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
