A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 2 of Article 2 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to the university system, so as to provide that noncitizen students with
- 3 certain refugee, special immigrant, or humanitarian parole status under federal law are
- 4 classified as in-state for tuition purposes subject to certain conditions; to provide for related
- 5 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Part 2 of Article 2 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to the university system, is amended in Code Section 20-3-66, relating to
- determination of in-state resident status of students for tuition or fees, by revising subsection
- 11 (e) as follows:

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- 12 "(e) Noncitizen students shall not be classified as in-state for tuition purposes unless the
- student is legally in this state and there is evidence to warrant consideration of in-state
- classification as determined by the board of regents. Lawful permanent residents, refugees,
- asylees, special immigrants, or other eligible noncitizens as defined by federal Title IV
- regulations may be extended the same consideration as citizens of the United States in

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17 determining whether they qualify for in-state classification; provided, however, that noncitizen students shall be classified as in-state for tuition purposes immediately upon 18 settlement in Georgia after being admitted to the United States as a refugee pursuant to 8 19 20 U.S.C. Section 1157; as a special immigrant pursuant to Public Law 110-181, Section 1244, as amended; Public Law 109-163, Section 1059, as amended; or Section 602(b) of 21 22 Title VI of Division F of Public Law 111-8, as amended; or, for Afghan citizens or nationals, on humanitarian parole; provided, further, that international. International 23 24 students who reside in the United States under nonimmigrant status conditioned at least in part upon intent not to abandon a foreign domicile shall not be eligible for in-state 25 classification." 26

27 SECTION 2.

28 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
