7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

9 This Act shall be known and may be cited as "The Maternity Supportive Housing Act."

SECTION 2.

- 11 Article 1 of Chapter 5 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 12 children and youth services, is amended in Code Section 49-5-3, relating to definitions, by
- 13 adding a new paragraph to read as follows:
- 14 "(13.1) 'Maternity supportive housing residence' means a residential home that houses
- on behalf of a church, religious organization, or nonprofit organization, up to six pregnant
- women aged 18 years or older and their children, at any one time during the woman's
- pregnancy and up to 18 months after childbirth; provided, however, that no other services
- other than housing shall be provided. This term shall not include women who receive
- maternity care in the home of a relative or in general or special hospitals."
- SECTION 3.
- 21 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 22 "49-5-25.
- 23 (a)(1) On and after July 1, 2020, all maternity supportive housing residences shall
- register under this Code section by submitting an application to the department, upon

25 <u>forms furnished by the department. The form shall require the name, address, and</u>

- 26 <u>telephone number of the maternity supportive housing residence and emergency contact</u>
- 27 <u>information.</u>
- 28 (2) A registrant shall be required to pay an annual registration fee of \$25.00 to the
- 29 <u>department.</u>
- 30 (3) The department shall issue a registration certificate, valid for one year, to a maternity
- 31 <u>supportive housing residence upon receipt of an application for registration, payment of</u>
- 32 <u>the registration fee, and attestation by the applicant that the maternity supportive housing</u>
- 33 <u>residence:</u>
- 34 (A) Has written policies and procedures for admission, intake, and record keeping;
- 35 (B) Is in compliance with applicable residential building codes; and
- 36 (C) Has property insurance coverage on the residence which covers the residents,
- 37 <u>newborns, and other children.</u>
- 38 (b) The department shall not have the authority to implement rules and regulations for the
- 39 <u>registration of maternity supportive housing residences but shall have the authority to</u>
- 40 <u>maintain any records submitted by a residence pursuant to paragraph (3) of subsection (a)</u>
- 41 <u>of this Code section.</u>
- 42 (c) No county, municipality, or consolidated government shall, by rule or ordinance,
- 43 <u>constrain the establishment or operation of maternity supportive housing residences or</u>
- 44 place occupancy requirements on such residences that would not apply to a single family
- 45 <u>living in the residence.</u>
- 46 (d) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to require a maternity home to register
- 47 with the department pursuant to this Code section or for a maternity supportive housing
- 48 <u>residence to obtain a license or permit as a maternity home or to meet the requirements of</u>
- 49 <u>a maternity home."</u>

SECTION 4.

51 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
