A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state
- 2 flag, seal, and other symbols, so as to provide for placement within the capitol building or
- 3 grounds of a braille American flag as a monument honoring blind veterans in Georgia and
- 4 the United States; to provide for a short title; to provide for design, procurement, and
- 5 placement of the monument; to provide that placement of the monument shall comply with
- 6 the federal Americans with Disabilities Act; to provide for a definition; to provide for related
- 7 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
- 9 SECTION 1.
- 10 Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state flag, seal,
- and other symbols, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:

12 "ARTICLE 8

- 13 50-3-130.
- 14 This article shall be known and may be cited as the 'Braille American Flag Monument
- 15 Honoring Blind Veterans Act of Georgia.'
- 16 50-3-131.
- 17 (a) Subject to the availability of funds, there shall be placed within the capitol building or
- grounds a braille American flag to serve as a monument honoring the blind veterans of
- 19 Georgia and the United States.
- 20 (b) Such monument shall be designed, procured, and placed by the Capitol Art Standards
- 21 <u>Commission in consultation with a charitable organization representing or providing</u>
- 22 <u>support to blind veterans</u>. The Capitol Art Standards Commission shall ensure that
- 23 placement of such monument complies with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act,
- 42 U.S.C. Section 12101, et seq., as amended, and shall address any access or safety
- concerns. For purposes of this subsection, the term 'charitable organization' means a
- 26 <u>nonprofit charitable organization which is exempt from taxation under the provisions of</u>
- 27 Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code.
- 28 (c)(1) Such monument shall be subject to final approval by a monument committee
- composed of the following members of the General Assembly:
- 30 (A) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the
- 31 <u>House of Representatives;</u>
- 32 (B) Two members of the Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; and
- 33 (C) One member from each house of the General Assembly appointed by the
- 34 Governor.
- 35 (2) The monument committee established pursuant to this subsection shall stand
- abolished upon placement of such monument.

- 41 (e) Such monument shall be procured and placed as soon as practicable but not before the
- 42 <u>state has been granted any intellectual property license necessary for purposes of this Code</u>
- 43 section."
