## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 4 of Title 38 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 2 relating to veterans benefits, so as to enact the "Veterans Postsecondary Education Act"; to 3 provide a short title; to provide for definitions; to provide for certain educational benefits to 4 veterans, their spouses, and children; to provide for in-state resident tuition rates for minor 5 children and spouses of veterans enrolled in the university system of higher learning and public postsecondary education programs; to provide for a fee waiver of online 6 7 postsecondary course work; to provide course credit based on military experience, education, 8 and training; to provide for the development and implementation of certain nursing degree 9 programs for veterans; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 10 purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 12 SECTION 1.
  13 Article 2 of Chapter 4 of Title 38 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 14 veterans benefits, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

15	″ <u>38-4-38.</u>
16	(a) This Code section shall be known and may be cited as the 'Veterans Postsecondary
17	Education Act.'
18	(b) As used in this Code section, the term:
19	(1) 'Armed forces' means the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, Space
20	Force, and Coast Guard, and also includes the units across those branches of the services
21	having women troops.
22	(2) 'Comprehensive Transition and Postsecondary Program for Students with Intellectual
23	Disabilities' has the same meaning as provided in 20 U.S.C. Section 1140.
24	(3) 'Tuition and fees' means fees paid for educational instruction.
25	(c) Any child of a disabled or deceased veteran or otherwise eligible for educational
26	benefits under this Code section who is admitted to attend and attends a comprehensive
27	transition and postsecondary program for students with intellectual disabilities at a
28	university system four-year college or university shall be eligible to receive benefits equal
29	to the benefits provided pursuant to this chapter, to any other child eligible for educational
30	benefits in an undergraduate course of study at a state four-year college or university under
31	this chapter without regard as to whether the program is a degree, certificate, or nondegree
32	program.
33	(d) For purposes of admission and tuition, a university system public institution of higher
34	education or public postsecondary program may consider that a resident student includes
35	any of the following:
36	(1) Any person who, at the time of registration, satisfies one of the following:
37	(A) Is a member or the spouse of a member of the armed forces on full-time active
38	duty stationed in Georgia under orders other than attending school;
39	(B) Is a veteran of the armed forces, provided that the veteran has become a resident
40	of Georgia and satisfies at least one of the following conditions:

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41	(i) The veteran has served on active duty for a continuous period of time, not less
42	than two years, and has received an honorable discharge as verified by a United States
43	Department of Defense Form 214 within five years of enrolling in a Georgia public
44	institution of higher education;
45	(ii) The veteran is currently serving in a reserve component of the armed forces, as
46	verified by a memorandum from the commanding officer of the veteran student; or
47	(iii) The veteran has been assigned a service-connected disability by the United
48	States Department of Veterans Affairs; or
49	(2) Any person who, at the time of initial registration, is a minor and whose supporting
50	person is a member of the armed forces on full-time active duty stationed in Georgia
51	under orders for duties other than attending school. A student establishing residency
52	pursuant to this paragraph shall continue to be considered a resident student, regardless
53	of any transfer of his or her supporting person to an out-of-state duty station, provided
54	that the student maintains continuous enrollment at that institution.
55	(e) The State of Georgia shall waive tuition and fees for each resident service member who
56	enrolls in an exclusively online, degree-offering institution that is associated with a
57	university system institution of higher education.
58	(f) Any public institution of higher education shall consider, in determining whether to
59	award to a student course credit toward a degree or certificate offered by the institution for
60	the student's completion of certain military training:
61	(1) Any official military record presented to the institution by the student that:
62	(A) Describes the substance of the training completed by the student; and
63	(B) Verifies the student's successful completion of that training; and
64	(2) Whether the substance of that training satisfies the purpose of the course for which
65	the student seeks credit as described in the institution's course catalog.
66	(g)(1) The Department of Veterans Service shall evaluate programs of study or courses
67	offered by a university system public institution of higher education or public

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postsecondary program leading to industry-based certifications or other workforce
 credentials to identify programs or courses for which skills obtained through military
 experience, education, and training frequently align.
 (2) The department shall publish on its website a list of any programs of study or courses
 identified by the department under this subsection and the relevant military experience,

- 73 education, or training that may align with those programs or courses.
- 74 (3) The department shall identify, develop, and support methods to facilitate the award 75 of course time credit by a university system public institution of higher education or 76 public postsecondary program or other private or nonprofit entities providing programs 77 of study or courses of instruction leading to industry certifications or other workforce 78 credentials to veterans and military service members for military experience, education, 79 or training obtained during military service for programs of study or courses of 80 instruction offered by those schools, colleges, or other entities for which skills obtained through military experience, education, and training align. 81 82 (h) The Department of Veterans Service shall cooperate with the proper officials of the
- 83 State Board of Education, the Department of Education, the State School Superintendent, 84 the Board of Regents and the Chancellor of the University System of Georgia, and all other 85 public education authorities, private schools, colleges, and universities of the state which are not under the official jurisdiction of the public educational authorities of the state in the 86 87 placing of veterans at such institutions for education and training and shall enable 88 participating colleges and institutions to apply specialized education and training 89 requirements toward requirements for an associate's degree in nursing or a bachelor's 90 degree in nursing and licensure as a licensed practical nurse or registered nurse. The 91 collaborating entities will also create a plan to promote and market these opportunities
- 92 <u>available for veterans in order to aid:</u>

- 94 private grants for gap-bridging Veteran Associate of Science in Nursing degrees or
- 95 Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree programs; and
- 96 (2) Service members in identifying prospective requirements for licensure as a licensed
- 97 practical nurse or registered nurse through either a Veteran Associate of Science in
- 98 <u>Nursing degree or a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree program.</u>"

- 100 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
