A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 5 of Title 30 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 "Disabled Adults and Elder Persons Protection Act," so as to prohibit retaliation against a
- 3 person relating to a report that a disabled adult or elder person is in need of protective
- 4 services or has been the victim of abuse, neglect, or exploitation; to provide for a right of
- 5 action; to provide for relief; to provide for statutory construction; to provide for related
- 6 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 5 of Title 30 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the "Disabled
- 10 Adults and Elder Persons Protection Act," is amended by adding a new Code section to read
- 11 as follows:

- 13 (a) No person shall discriminate or retaliate in any manner against:
- (1) Any person who makes a report pursuant to this chapter, who testifies in any judicial
- proceeding arising from the report, who provides protective services, who participates in
- an investigation, or who participates on an Adult Abuse, Neglect, and Exploitation
- Multidisciplinary Team under the provisions of this chapter; or
- 18 (2) Any disabled adult or elder person who is the subject of a report.
- 19 (b)(1) Any person or official required by paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of Code Section
- 20 <u>30-5-4 to report a case of disabled adult or elder person abuse shall have a right of action</u>
- 21 <u>for retaliation against an employer for such reports made, including to the employer, if</u>
- 22 the reporting is used as a basis for an employment decision adversely affecting the
- 23 <u>claimant, including, but not limited to, termination, demotion, transfer, or reassignment</u>
- 24 <u>to an inferior or less desirable position, change in job duties, work schedule, or other</u>
- 25 <u>similarly unfavorable treatment.</u>
