A RESOLUTION

- 1 Supporting increased protections for America's borders; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, on January 20, 2021, President Joe Biden terminated the national emergency
- 3 at our southern border declared by Proclamation 9844 and halted the funding and
- 4 construction of the border wall; and
- 5 WHEREAS, within his own proclamation, President Biden described the construction of the
- 6 wall as "a waste of money that diverts attention from genuine threats to our homeland
- 7 security" and declared that former-President Donald Trump's determination of a national
- 8 emergency at our southern border "was unwarranted"; and
- 9 WHEREAS, despite President Biden's subsequent legislative efforts to ostensibly modernize
- 10 our immigration system and secure our border against criminal activity, United States
- 11 Customs and Border Protection reports that illicit fentanyl smuggling is increasing, notably
- 12 across the southern border; and
- WHEREAS, the amount of fentanyl seized has increased by 480 percent since Fiscal Year
- 14 2020, representing a staggering 26,700 pounds recovered in Fiscal Year 2023 compared to
- 15 just 4,600 pounds in 2020; and

16 WHEREAS, as written by Texas Governor Greg Abbott on January 24, 2024, President

- 17 Biden "has violated his oath to faithfully execute immigration laws enacted by Congress,"
- 18 "instructed his agencies to ignore federal statutes that mandate the detention of illegal
- 19 immigrants," and "inflicted unprecedented harm on the People all across the United States";
- 20 and
- 21 WHEREAS, in accordance with Article I, Section 10, Clause 3 of the United States
- 22 Constitution, which acknowledges "the States' sovereign interest in protecting their borders,"
- 23 the State of Texas has declared an invasion and invoked its constitutional authority to defend
- 24 and protect itself, leading to the launch of Operation Lone Star; and
- 25 WHEREAS, this multi-agency effort has since led to more than 496,700 illegal immigrant
- apprehensions, 38,700 criminal arrests, and 35,100 felony charges, successfully filling the
- 27 dangerous gaps created by the Biden Administration's refusal to secure the border; and
- 28 WHEREAS, in circumstances where the American people continue to suffer due to the
- 29 inadequacy of actions taken by their federal government, it falls upon all other public
- 30 servants to speak against such injustice and act decisively to rectify it.
- 31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 32 the members of this body support increased protection for America's borders in the pursuit
- of ending the illegal immigration and smuggling that has long threatened our people.
- 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this body support any action taken by
- 35 Governor Brian Kemp to allocate resources and assistance to the protection of the southern
- 36 border as well as the actions of Governor Greg Abbott to safeguard the people of Texas.

- 38 the southern border and reinstate funding for as well as construction of the border wall.
- 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this body condemn President Joe
- 40 Biden's executive actions relating to the southern border and urge for the reinstatement of
- 41 former-President Donald Trump's border policies, specifically Executive Order 13768 and
- 42 Proclamation 9844.
- 43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 44 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 45 public and the press.
