1 Recognizing February 7–14, 2020, as Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week at the state

2 capitol; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, congenital heart defects are one of the most frequently occurring birth defects
and a leading cause of deaths related to birth defects worldwide; and

5 WHEREAS, over one million families across America face the challenges and hardships of 6 raising children with congenital heart defects; each year, approximately 40,000 babies are

7 born in the United States with these conditions; and

8 WHEREAS, some congenital heart defects are not diagnosed until months or years after birth
9 and when these conditions go undiagnosed, they can cause sudden cardiac death in young

10 athletes; and

WHEREAS, despite these alarming statistics, newborns and young athletes are still not
regularly screened for congenital heart defects; and

WHEREAS, Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week provides an opportunity for families whose lives have been affected by congenital heart defects to celebrate life, remember the loved ones they have lost, honor dedicated health professionals, and share information with the public and the media.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
the members of this body recognize February 7–14, 2020, as Congenital Heart Defect
Awareness Week at the state capitol.
