A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the rise of cardiovascular disease as the world's leading cause of preventable
- 2 death and disability and as the global public health crisis of our generation and supporting
- 3 the recognition of February 2023 as American Heart Month; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, cardiovascular disease affects men, women, and children of every age and race
- 5 in the United States; from 2019 to 2020, deaths from heart disease increased by 4.8 percent,
- 6 the largest increase in heart disease deaths since 2012, and stroke deaths increased in the
- 7 same period by 6 percent; cardiovascular disease continues to be the leading cause of death
- 8 in the United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, in 2015, cardiovascular disease accounted for \$555,000,000,000 in health care
- 10 expenditures and lost productivity, and by 2035, cardiovascular disease will account for
- \$1,093,900,000,000 in health care expenditures and lost productivity annually; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the global COVID-19 disease pandemic poses a significantly high risk to
- 13 individuals with CVD and risk factors; and

14 WHEREAS, individuals in the United States have made great progress in reducing the death

- 15 rate for cardiovascular disease, but this progress has been more modest with respect to the
- death rate for cardiovascular disease in women and minorities; and
- 17 WHEREAS, cardiovascular diseases are the number one killer of women in the United
- 18 States, killing more women than all forms of cancer combined, and cardiovascular disease
- 19 is the leading cause of maternal death in the United States; more simply put, heart disease
- 20 is the No. 1 killer of new moms; and
- 21 WHEREAS, women, especially Black and Hispanic women, are disproportionally impacted
- 22 by heart disease and stroke, and research shows heart attacks are on the rise in younger
- women. Even still, younger generations of women, gen Z, and millennials are less likely to
- be aware of their greatest health threat, including knowing the warning signs of heart attacks
- and strokes.
- 26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 27 the members of this body recognize the rise of cardiovascular disease as the world's leading
- 28 cause of preventable death and disability and support the recognition of February 2023 as
- 29 American Heart Month.
- 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 32 press and the public.
