A RESOLUTION

Recognizing February 5-9, 2024, as Prescribed Fire Awareness Week; and for other
 purposes.

WHEREAS, the Georgia Prescribed Burning Act of 1992 declares and protects prescribed
burning as a valuable and necessary forest management tool; and

WHEREAS, prescribed burning is defined as a fire set under controlled conditions to burn
forest understory and is used as a forest management practice to establish favorable seedbeds,
remove competing underbrush, accelerate nutrient cycling, control tree pests, enhance
wildlife habitat, and contribute to ecological benefits; and

9 WHEREAS, prescribed fire is a cost-effective and necessary tool for maintaining healthy10 forests; and

WHEREAS, prescribed burning of Georgia's forestland is a valuable land management
practice for protecting the forest from devastating wildfires and managing wildlife species;
and

14 WHEREAS, of Georgia's 37 million acres of land area, 24.6 million acres is forest land; and

WHEREAS, of Georgia's 24.6 million acres of forest land, 24.1 million acres is privately held timberland available for commercial use—more than any other state in the nation. The state's forest lands provide a myriad of benefits to citizens, including clean air and clean water; and

WHEREAS, the Georgia Forestry Commission, partner agencies, and organizations across
the state support, promote, educate, and train for the continued use of prescribed burning for
public benefit and safety; and

WHEREAS, the State of Georgia has issued more than 71,000 prescribed burning permits over a five-year period, which has allowed for the use of prescribed burning as a management tool on more than 6,000,000 acres; and

WHEREAS, the State of Georgia joins in thanking those land managers who protect andmaintain Georgia's natural heritage for present and future generations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
the members of this body recognize February 5-9, 2024, as Prescribed Fire Awareness Week
in the State of Georgia.
