## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Senior Judge George H. Kreeger; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, Senior Judge George H. Kreeger was born in Cobb County, graduated from
3 Campbell High School, and received his Bachelor of Science and Juris Doctorate degrees

4 from the University of Georgia. He was in the private practice for 13 years, during which

5 time he also served in the Georgia House of Representatives for eight years; and

6 WHEREAS, Judge Kreeger was appointed to serve as a State Court Judge in January 1979,
7 serving on that bench until June 1984, when he was appointed to the Cobb Superior Court
8 Bench where he served with distinction. He has served as chief judge of the Cobb Superior
9 Court, as the administrative judge for the Seventh Judicial District, and on the Judicial
10 Council of Georgia; and

11 WHEREAS, he is a member of the Cobb Bar Association and the State Bar of Georgia; and

WHEREAS, Judge Kreeger is involved in many community activities such as the Smyrna Optimist Club, where he has served as president and as a lieutenant governor, and was selected as the 2012 Smyrna Optimist of the Year. He is the recipient of the Cobb County Legal Secretaries Association Boss of the Year Award and the Cherokee Rose Chapter of the American Business Women's Association Boss of the Year Award; and

WHEREAS, he is a member of the First Methodist Church of Smyrna. He and his wife,Hellan, live in Kennesaw, and they have three daughters and eight grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Judge Kreeger is the presiding judge of the Cobb County Superior Court Drug
Treatment Court, over which he has presided since its inception in 2002. He has served as
the chair of the Judicial Council of Georgia's Standing Committee on Drug Treatment
Courts; and
