## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing military chaplains from the State of Georgia for their faithful service to the men  
2 and women in the armed services of the United States; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, military chaplains from the State of Georgia have honorably and faithfully  
4 served the nation and have defended its freedoms with courage as members of the armed  
5 services of the United States; and

6 WHEREAS, these chaplains serve honorably in combat zones and hazardous duty areas and  
7 are sacrificially enduring many personal hardships, including hostile fire, family separation,  
8 and loss of employment; and

9 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia supports military chaplains from other states that are  
10 serving or who have served in the armed services of the United States; and

11 WHEREAS, military chaplains are supporting the service member marital bond and its  
12 resiliency through their work efforts with the Warrior2Citizen, Inc., Home Life Transition  
13 Program; and

14 WHEREAS, all Georgians are encouraged to pray for and support this state's military  
15 chaplains, other members of the armed services of the United States and their families, and  
16 those families whose loved ones have given the last full measure of devotion to duty.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
18 the members of this body recognize military chaplains from the State of Georgia for their  
19 faithful service to the men and women in the armed services of the United States and express  
20 appreciation for their innumerable good works rendered on behalf of persons in need.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
22 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the  
23 public and the press.
