A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 19, 2020, as Girls Empowerment Day at the state capitol; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the Organization of World Leaders, founded in December, 2016, by Dr. Dee
- 4 Dawkins-Haigler, and Trinity Girls Network, founded in July, 2016, by Dr. Jacqueline
- 5 Mohair, in partnership with the UN Global Awards strive to empower girls and young
- 6 women by using a three-stemmed approach: ending violence against girls and women,
- 7 preparing girls for success, and providing opportunity through education; and
- 8 WHEREAS, globally, 65 million girls and young women are not in school, 31 million girls
- 9 of primary school age are not in school, and 33 million fewer girls than boys attend primary
- school; sadly, 17 million of these girls will never attend school in their lifetimes; and
- 11 WHEREAS, of the more than 120 million young people between the ages of 15 and 24 who
- 12 cannot read or write, 61 percent are women; and
- 13 WHEREAS, half of the children who are not in school live in conflict-ridden areas, and girls
- make up 55 percent these children; and
- 15 WHEREAS, of nearly 70 million children worldwide who do not have access to a basic
- 16 education, more than half are girls; and evidence shows that educating a girl can break a
- 17 cycle of poverty in just one generation; and
- 18 WHEREAS, girls who get an education marry later, have fewer children, earn higher wages,
- and support healthier and more prosperous families; the empowerment of and investment in
- 20 girls are key factors in breaking the cycle of discrimination and violence and are instrumental
- 21 in promoting and protecting the full and effective enjoyment of their human rights; and

WHEREAS, a girl with an extra year of education can earn 20 percent more as an adult, and

- 23 a child born to a mother who can read and write is 50 percent more likely to survive past the
- age of five; moreover, educated mothers are more than twice as likely to send their children
- 25 to school; and
- 26 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia is blessed with hundreds of gifted girls and young women
- 27 whose full potential has yet to be fostered and developed; and
- 28 WHEREAS, education is the key to the empowerment of this state's girls and young women,
- 29 fostering the development of their minds and their academic and leadership skills and playing
- a vital role in shaping tomorrow's leaders.
- 31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 32 the members of this body recognize February 19, 2020, as Girls Empowerment Day at the
- 33 state capitol.
- 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 35 and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to
- 36 Trinity Girls Network.
